

Salsa Shark Steak



Anyone fond of Tex-Mex, a sometimes tongue-blistering cuisine, is familiar with salsa. The tomato-based sauce is an excellent topping for shark steak. It enhances the rather delicate taste of the better shark meats.

Anglers elsewhere may capture other species—most of them good eating. Porbeagle, sand sharks, threshers—all rate well. In Latin America other sharks are salted and sold as "bacalao"—much like salt cod. The British fish 'n chips is usually shark fil-

let. A Miami seafood distributor told me he ships thousands of pounds of frozen shark meat across the U.S. every month.

Catch one and you've got to kill it, gut it, and ice it immediately—right now—or it will spoil. Commercially caught shark is usually treated properly.

Because shark steak can be bland, we marinated ours in a little olive oil and a lot of lime juice for about a half hour. No more. It was then simply pan-broiled in more olive oil mixed with butter.

Ruth made the salsa: three finely chopped tomatoes, two cloves of garlic, four or five green onions—including the green part—half a purple onion and some parsley. Add a healthy dash of oregano. Also chop three or four green chilies. If mild, add a chopped jalapeno for blister power—or use Tabasco to taste. Finally, stir in a smidgen of Extra Virgin olive oil.

Marinating in an acidic solution helps kill any ammonia taste in poorly handled shark. Equal parts of white wine, water and lemon or lime juice also work wonders. But on properly dressed shark you don't need that.

Salsa Shark Steak surprisingly similar to swordfish, and you can't beat the price!

Last on list was a biggy, an X-ray machine to be set up at office in Rocky Pt (a lot closer than U.S. border folks) to help determine broken bones. The new dorm remains dormant since footer, for revision of blueprints. They wish to have prints where any layman (volunteer) can understand.

We stayed at Vista Del Mar Cabin #2 at Cholla Bay. The water supply and power worked at will (theirs). We made do and it was shelter from wind gusts of 29th:

Florence met a member of the Rotary Club of Mexico and saw the building in progress intended for the aged/homeless in Rocky Pt. She intends to divert some of the foundation funds for this cause.
