4TH OF JULY OBSC BBQ

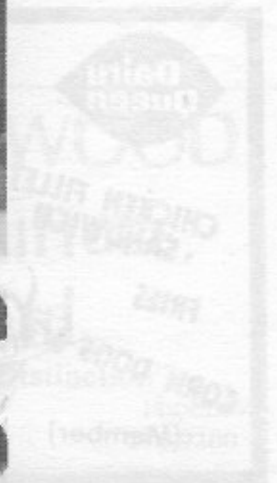

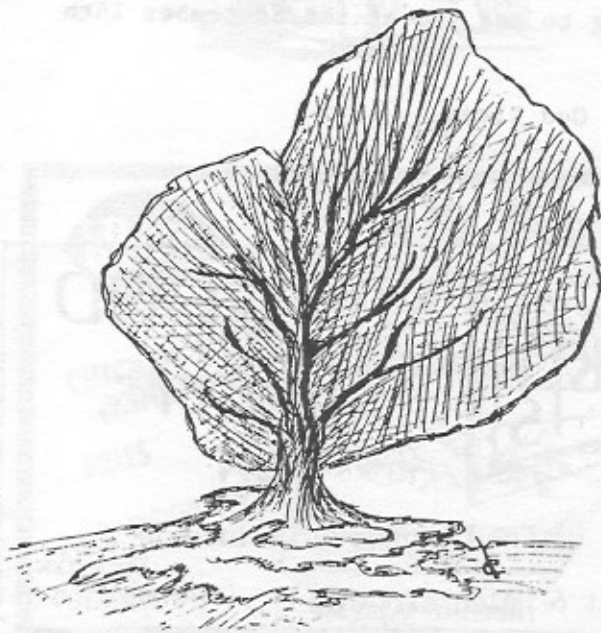

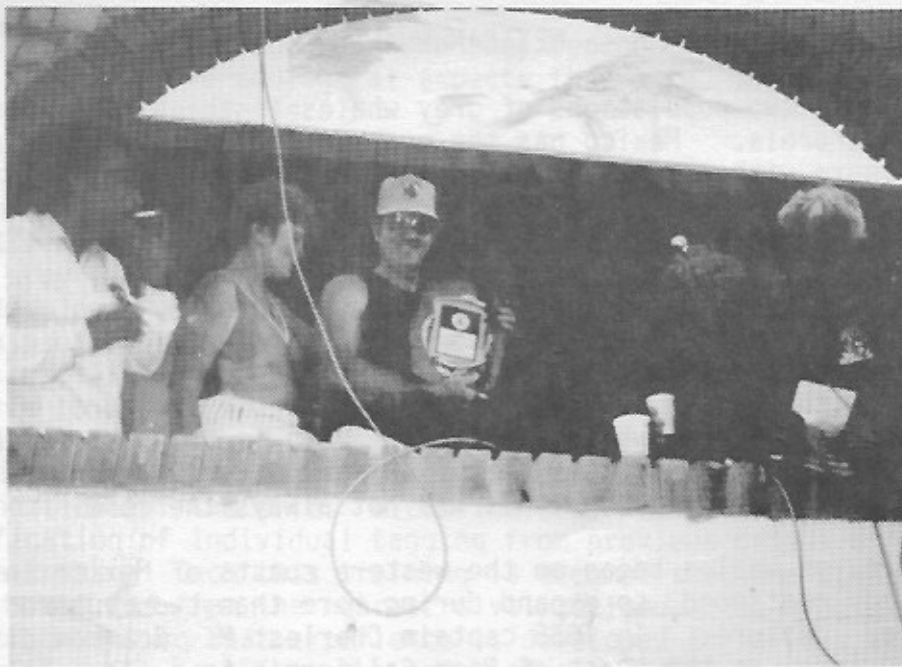

MEXICAN WHALES

There are only two populations of grey whales in the world: In Korea and in Baja California. Mexico has the most important grey whale nursery in this hemisphere with more than 50% of the total population.

I. BAJA CALIFORNIA AND ITS IMPORTANCE FOR WHALES AT A GLOBAL LEVEL

Each year during a period of four months the grey whales embark on a journey south from the Arctic to find an appropriate place to give birth to their offspring and to mate. These whales find Baja California an ideal spot. As with the sea turtle, Mexico has become a natural site for the reproduction of the grey whale. Thus our nation is responsible to the world for the preservation of this marvelous mammal. Currently the whale population is stable, although this was not always the case.

The capture of whales began on the western coasts of Mexico in the 18th Century and continued to expand during more than two hundred years of uncontrolled capture. In 1855 captain Charles M. Scammon discovered a natural nursery on the coast of Baja California in a place called Laguna Ojo de Liebre, where one had only to wait for the whales and capture them.

Captain Scammon calculated a grey whale population of 30,000. In only two years and with the increase in the capture, a ship's log reported the extinction of the grey whale.

With the exploitation of the specie in 1870 and the decrease in the demand for products derived from whales their extinction was halted. This period was not noted for its conservation practices or the protection of this mammal. Nevertheless, nature protects itself and the whales that escaped capture began the slow process of restoring the population. However, when the numbers of whales reached a point at which they could be exploited hunting began again so that by 1930 there was an average capture of 700 whales per day. Once again the grey whale was considered extinct.

It was not until 1933 in Geneva that the environmental conscience emerged and an agreement was signed for the international protection of the species. This agreement was signed by several countries including Mexico. In 1936 the United States prohibited the capture of grey whales in its territorial waters or by any US citizen. In 1972 Mexico declared Baja California as a refuge for the grey whale and its offspring; in 1979 San Ignacio Lagoon and the lagoons of Guerrero Negro and Manuela were added to the refuge areas.

Thanks to the work of researchers and the success of the conservation of the whales, Mexico received the award of the Golden Trident for its work in whale research; as well, it was given the Vice-presidency of the Technical Committee of the International Whaling Commission.

II. MEXICO'S WHALE PROTECTION PROGRAM

In 1970 Mexico established the National Program for Marine Mammal Research and Conservation, under the leadership of the National Institute of Fisheries. This program began to take form in 1979 with research on population dynamics and distribution patterns of the grey whale and its

seasonal abundance in the lagoons where they reproduce and mate as well as the recognition of the ecological aspects that make these lagoons the preferred place for the whales.

Since 1979 scientists and students that apply for permits to participate in research camps in Laguna Ojo de Liebre, Guerrero Negro and in the northern part of Magdalena Bay, where the grey whale is studied during the eighty days of its stay in the area. A group of students from various disciplines principally biology, oceanography, veterinary medicine and some students of the humanities are systematically trained for the coordinated studies in the various camps, including aerial surveys.

Dr Luis Fleisher is the overall director of the project who coordinates the practical/theoretic work that records the direction of travel, numbers, ecologic conditions of the site, birth indices, adaptation of calves and the identification of individual tagging from previous census to establish migration patterns. Once this training is accomplished the students begin their studies 600 kms from the nearest civilization. The program includes a rotation of duties so that experience is developed in various aspects of the research becoming in this way a model of active education.

During the period of research the climate is harsh with temperatures below freezing, with a sun that dries the skin without warming; the shifts are two hours each for a specific activity. While some gather information others patrol the lagoons analyzing the environment; on occasion students have to return stranded calves to the water when they become separated from their mothers. The water is always cold and many risks are present in this task, but if a calf is not reunited with its mother it will surely perish.

Each year there are more candidates than can be accommodated. It is an indication of a new attitude toward the service to the environment that so many are willing to face the hardships of isolation and arduous effort required to work with the extraordinary mammal. It is an experience that enriches the participants and their studies.

III. PRONATURA PROUDLY PARTICIPATES IN THIS WHALE PROGRAM

Dr Fleisher, Director of the project approached PRONATURA as a result of the success with the turtle protection. After nine years the economic crisis of the country has prevented the purchase of supplies and equipment necessary to the protection and study of this, the largest of all mammals on the earth. PRONATURA participates in an agreement and provides economic support to the project thanks to the generous contributions of concerned institutions and individuals who care.

Thanks to the participation in this project of concerned individuals the international community has recognized this protection effort that has permitted the whale populations not only to recover but increase; nevertheless environmental problems still exist. We must make every effort to maintain this type of scientific project that will permit a combination of tourism, recreation and educational activities. We invite you to join us with your contribution to this very special conservation task.

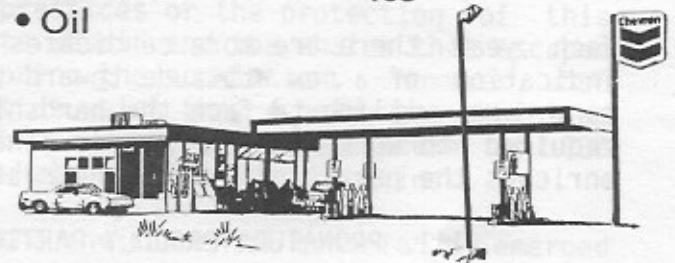

EGG-AND-BACON SALAD

Although this recipe sounds more like breakfast fare, it is perfect for a brunch or luncheon entrée.

MAKES 4 MAIN-DISH OR 6 SALAD SERVINGS

- 12 quail eggs or 4 large (chicken) eggs
- 4 slices bacon
- 2 tablespoons dry sherry
- 1 tablespoon sherry vinegar

- ¼ cup sunflower oil
- Salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 small head radicchio
- 1 large bunch lamb's lettuce (mâche) or arugula
- ½ bunch red-leaf lettuce
- ¼ head curly endive

1. Hard-cook the eggs; cool and shell. Refrigerate until cold. If using large eggs, cut each into quarters.
2. Cut bacon slices crosswise into ½-inch lengths. In large skillet, cook bacon, stirring frequently, just until lightly browned. Drain on paper towels. Pour off and discard bacon fat from skillet.
3. For the salad dressing, add sherry and vinegar to skillet; heat to boiling, stirring to loosen browned-on bits. Remove from heat; stir in oil, and salt and pepper to taste; set aside.
4. Wash salad greens and dry well. Tear large leaves into bite-size pieces and leave small ones whole. In individual salad bowls or one large serving bowl, arrange salad greens and eggs. Sprinkle salad with bacon; drizzle with salad dressing.
