Bobby Hannan has 35 years experience in fiberglass work and is an expert in his field.

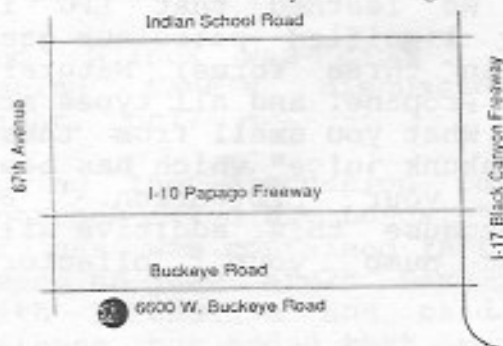

Peggy and Bill's daughter, Toni Apple, made a beautiful latchhook wall hanging. It was raffled off for our Christmas party.

Mr. David Lenox, III, an Inspector and Captain with the Tucson Fire Department was our guest speaker. Dave made a big mistake. As a dutiful Public Servant, he wore a tie. And we all know how the people at Pinnacle Peak feel about ties.

After his initiation, Mr. Lenox showed some very graphic pictures of what can happen when you are careless with LPG. We learned that LPG is short for liquified petroleum gas. LPG comes in three forms; Natural, Butane and Propane; and all types are odorless. What you smell from these gases is "skunk juice" which has been added for your protection. Be careful because this additive will eventually numb your olfactory nerves.

He cautioned that your propane tank should be away from any building, and if your tank doesn't have a blow out valve(rose plug), get rid of it or have one installed. Always use a trained technician for this and any service on any gas appliance. Each of the three types of LPG use a different size of jet on appliances.

Dave stated that there were 3 classes of fires. Class A is normal combustables, Class B is liquids, and Class C is electrical. Water is the best for putting out most fires and Dave recommended that everyone in Cholla own a two and a half gallon pressurized water extinguisher. He said that dry chemical extinguishers have a tendency to leak the propellant and the powder cakes at the bottom of a tank, especially when they are not serviced. He cautioned the use of Halon extinguishers in extremely high temperatures. Baking Soda works best on grease fires.

Mr. Lenox encouraged our club to have sessions on First Aid and CPR. Everyone should be trained in the fundamentals of First Aid.

Doc Wilcox was caught catnapping during Dave's discussion. Late night, Doc??

During the discussion period, Bob Rothrock asked Mr. Lenox, "What kind of gas was contained in the bowl of beans he just ate?" Dave responded with a chuckle and said a form of methane, but added that you do not have to add "skunk juice" to that type of gas.
