MARCH BRINGS GOOD HALIBUT FISHING TO CHOLLA BAY FISHERMEN

If you're not the best at finding reefs or just don't know Cholla Bay, then you should try halibut fishing. Unlike grouper fishing you don't need to go 12 to 26 miles out. All you need to do is go outside the bay 1/4 to 1/2 mile, which makes this kind of fishing perfect for car-top style boats. Of course that doesn't mean that big boats can't fish for halibut.

The tackle you will need for halibut fishing is fairly basic. For a reel I like the Penn 500L Jigmaster filled with 30 pound line. Remember, buy the best line you can afford, you get what you pay for. Almost any rod rated 15 to 50 pounds will work fine. I prefer the Sabre 670C 7 foot 20 to 50 pound rod. I like this rod because its' progressive action enables it to handle the extra weight added by the sinker. Your best choice for hooks would be Mustad 94150 bait hook in 5/o size and a half dozen torpedo sinkers in 6 to 8 oz. sizes. You will also need a couple of lucky jo bait rigs for catching the bass you will use as bait. Rig your 5/o hook on a 12 inch dropper loop 2 feet above your weight. If you're not familiar with this dropper loop, Charlie Davis' book 'hook Up' has this information.

Now that you are rigged you will need to fillet some of the rock bass you caught with your bait rigs. Pin the fillet to your 5/o hook and send it to the bottom. When the bait hits the bottom you will start to feel small taps. Those taps are the bass picking your bait clean. It is when this tapping stops that a halibut is approaching your bait, get ready. You will know when the halibut grabs your bait, set the hook and start reeling. It won't be long before he floats to the top like a large doormat. Gaff the fish carefully and bring it into the boat. Remember, halibut do most of their fighting once they hit the deck of your boat. Be careful, halibut have been know to break a person's wrist or ankle.

When fishing for halibut it is best not to anchor. You should try to drift and keep the boat in about forty feet of water and over sand. Your best bet for halibut is from Pelican Point north. Remember, keep only what you can eat so that this wonderful resource will be here for future generations to enjoy.

1990 FISHING DERBY RULES

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License and a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. All boats must be launched from Cholla Bay and have a valid Mexican boat permit. Participants must fill out a launch slip before entering the water, and may not launch prior to the Derby date. All fish must be caught on a hook and line.
- 2. Classes of fish eligible for prizes:

GROUPER MACKEREL COCHI PINTO
DOLPHIN SARDINERO BLACK SEA BASS RED SNAPPER
LEATHER FISH SEA TROUT PARGO SKIP JACK
POMPANO FLOUNDER SAILFISH

IT IS PROHIBITED TO CATCH AND KEEP SPECIES OF TOTOABA (WHITE SEA BASS).

3. Judging and prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize Winner for men, women and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking the Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:

The scales will be open for weighing from 8:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except the last day, Saturday, June 9, 1990, when the scales will close promptly at Noon. These closing times will be strictly enforced. Any fish presented for judging must be accompanied by the Derby Ticket of the person claiming the catch. The date, species and weight of the fish will be recorded on the back of said Derby Ticket at the time of weigh-in.

5. Derby Tickets:

Derby Tickets which entitle the purchaser to fish the entire Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per adult and \$5.00 per Junior. Daily Derby Tickets may be purchased on the days you wish to fish for \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per Junior. These will be available each day of the Derby at the Radio Room and Launch Area. There will be no refund on tickets after Derby starts.

6. Fish Fry and Awards Ceremony:

THE FISH FRY WILL BEGIN AT 4:00 P.M. ON SATURDAY, JUNE 9, 1990.

The Awards Ceremony and Jackpot Ticket Drawings will follow the fish fry. Members of the C.B.S.C. and guests, Derby participants and families and Cholla Bay residents are welcome to come to the Fish Fry. Identification will be required.

7. Cash Jackpot Drawing:

Tickets will be sold at 6 for \$5.00 or \$1.00 each individually. Sixty (60) percent of this money is for the <u>CASH DRAWING</u> held at the Fish Fry and Forty (40) percent is for the C.B.S.C.

8. Super-Jackpots:

Mens: Super-Jackpot entry fee will be a donation of \$100.00 per boat or individual. Women's: Mini-Super Jackpot entry fee will be a donation of \$20.00 per individual. One-half of each Jackpot (Men & Women) goes to the two individuals catching the largest fish on Derby Days. The other half goes to C.B.S.C. Derby rules apply.

9. All decisions of the Weigh-in Judges and Derby Chairman are final.





Also guys, check your gas tank.....






