



There was a letter from Ross and Annie Sotels asking for donations for the St. Vincent Center, clothes, food, blankets and cash.





dumping on the ground. Your cooperation and use are welcome.







1990 FISHING DERBY RULES

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License and a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. All boats must be launched from Cholla Bay and have a valid Mexican boat permit. Participants must fill out a launch slip before entering the water, and may not launch prior to the Derby date. All fish must be caught on a hook and line.
- 2. Classes of fish eligible for prizes:

GROUPER MACKEREL COCHI PINTO
DOLPHIN SARDINERO BLACK SEA BASS RED SNAPPER
LEATHER FISH SEA TROUT PARGO SKIP JACK
POMPANO FLOUNDER SAILFISH

IT IS PROHIBITED TO CATCH AND KEEP SPECIES OF TOTOABA (WHITE SEA BASS).

3. Judging and prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize Winner for men, women and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking the Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:

The scales will be open for weighing from 8:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except the last day, Saturday, June 9, 1990, when the scales will close promptly at Noon. These closing times will be strictly enforced. Any fish presented for judging must be accompanied by the Derby Ticket of the person claiming the catch. The date, species and weight of the fish will be recorded on the back of said Derby Ticket at the time of weigh-in.

5. Derby Tickets:

Derby Tickets which entitle the purchaser to fish the entire Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per adult and \$5.00 per Junior. There will be no refund on tickets after Derby starts.

6. Fish Fry and Awards Ceremony:

THE FISH FRY WILL BEGIN AT 4:00 P.M. ON SATURDAY, JUNE 9, 1990.

The Awards Ceremony and Jackpot Ticket Drawings will follow the fish fry. Members of the C.B.S.C. and guests, Derby participants and families and Cholla Bay residents are welcome to come to the Fish Fry. Identification will be required.


7. Cash Jackpot Drawing:



Spring breakers swarm to Mexico

Town of Puerto Peñasco braces for 15,000 rowdy U.S. students

PUERTO PEÑASCO, Mexico "Why do they scream?" asked taco vender Luis Borboa as a Jeep-load of howling students rooster-tailed around the sandy turnoff to Cholla Bay.

Between bites of smoky-tasting meat tacos, a U.S. student tried to describe the overpowering sense of release that came from abandoning tests, textbooks and teachers.

"Think of it as a cry of freedom," said Ron Potts, 24, a senior at Northern Arizona University.

Borboa smiled softly and

It's spring break, and the more than 45,000 residents of Puerto Peñasco are bracing for the annual invasion of college students from throughout the Southwestern United States, mostly Arizona, California and Colorado. Puerto Peñasco is just south of the Arizona border near the north end of the Gulf of California.

Over the next three weeks, Rocky Point, as it's called by U.S. citizens, will become a giant sandbox for an estimated 15,000 youth, city officials say.

The swarming students are both a blessing and a curse, the officials say. The students come for a week of sun, sand, sea, booze and fun. City officials and local merchants welcome the money the students pump into the local economy.

"These weeks are important to us because the shrimp and fishing industry has been down this year," said Genaro Gastelum, the mayor of Puerto Peñasco. "So we are trying to diversify our economic base to attract more tourists."

Gastelum said this normally tranquil seaside town has a program to attract more tourists. The program is coordinated at the state and federal levels of government, he said.

But city officials put out caution signs along with the

welcome mats.

"We are ready for a lot of accidents and injuries," Traffic Police Chief Manuel Camacho Lopez said from his office at City Hall. "Many of these accidents are because of the heavy drinking."

The Reef Bar next to Sandy Beach, the most popular spot for students to camp, has stocked 4,000 cases of beer for the next two weeks bartender Mike Rodriguez said.

JJ's Cantina, another popular night spot in Cholla Bay, also has plenty of beer on ice, co-owner John Fowler said. 'Most of these kids are well-behaved. They just sometimes get too energetic," he said.

Red Cross officials know this and are geared up to handle more emergencies involving

U.S. youths.

Last year, Red Cross assistant commander Jorge Gomez said, five U.S. citizens died. In all five fatal accidents, alcohol was involved, he said.

There also were 330 injuries, Gomez said. Many were caused by dune buggy or all-ter-rain-cycle drivers fueled by

alcohol and drugs.

This year, he said, the Red Cross is coordinating an emergency plan with the police, the local Rotary and Lions clubs and the Mexican coast guard to accommodate the students.


"Most of the calls we get are in the Los Conchas, Sandy Beach or Cholla Bay areas where the Americans are," Gomez said. "We don't get any calls here in town.'

The Red Cross has four

ambulances and about 50 workers and volunteers for emergencies, he said.

Many U.S. students are oblivious to the dangers of too much reveling, city official Edrulfo Rivera said.

"They just go crazy and aren't too careful," he said. "They bring these accidents by not obeying our laws."



CATCH AND RELEASE OF GROUPERS

Having just returned from Cholla Bay, I am excited by the good fishing. It only gets better this time of year. However, an important consideration for recreational fishermen is the preservation of our limited fishing resources which are under heavy commercial pressure as well as overfishing on the part of others.

Many people who fish for the three reef fish are most commonly caught out of the Cholla area (grouper, pinto, and sardinero) don't realize that these species of fish are hatched as females. These fish undergo sexual transformation (Hermaphrodism) from female to male at approximately 5 years of age. How large is a 5 year old grouper? Dr. Richard Rosenblatt of Scripps Oceanographics Institute estimates female to male transformation occurs between 15 to 25 pounds, depending on feeding habits and sperm to egg ratios in specific environmental regions. It is safe to assume that groupers under 20 pounds are females and should be released if at all possible. Ten pounds is a good estimate for female pintos and sardineros.

The possibilities and methods of catch and release of small groupers, pintos, and sardineros are limited. The depth of water that fish are brought up from is the most critical limitation. Fish caught in over 100 feet of water have a marginal chance to survive because of nitrogen blowing out their air bladders (the bends). The slower a fish is brought up improves its chances of survival. Slowly pulling the fish alongside the boat with a catch and release gaff position (floor of mouth) will usually revive the fish. It is almost always possible to release the fish caught in shallower water as long as the hook or gaff have not damaged the gullet of gills producing profuse bleeding.

So let your conscience be your guide and help preserve the outstading sport fishing that we are blessed with in the Cholla Bay area. Our children will thank us for the opportunity to enjoy fishing the Gulf as we have.


