





The Grand Prize winner is Darwin Ritchhart who caught a 101½# grouper. Ginger Sinanovic caught a 90# grouper to win the Grand Prize, Women's Division. "Hats off" to Richard Erickson for winning the Grand Prize Junior Division, with a 78½# grouper. CONGRATULATIONS!! Show off your trophies and wear your hats proudly.

Darwin Ritchhart won the Men's Super Jackpot and Ginger Sinanovic won the Women's Mini-Jackpot for the above mentioned fish.

The biggest surprise of the Derby was when Tom Brown (Double Trouble) caught a $67\frac{1}{2}$ # sailfish. Tom was as surprised as anyone, as he was fishing for bait fish at the time. This is the first sailfish caught in 5 years, so Tom received a special trophy. Would you believe he brought it in on 25# test line?

The winners of the Dinners for Two for the largest fish caught each day ran from Darwin's 101½# grouper to Marti Beazley's 1# 6oz cochi.
