It would seem as if some of our members, who shall remain nameless, had met officer Sandoval on the road and they renewed a friendly acquaintance. Also, one of our members commended them for their friendly, efficient help when they lost an axle and were stranded on the road.

The following suggestions/tips were given by them for traveling across the reservation:

- The reservation police have cb units and frequently monitor Channel 19.
- Travel South of Route 86 is restricted due to the drug traffic problem in that area. The one exception is Baboquivari Park which can be visited with a permit obtainable from the reservation police in Sells.
- If you see a drunk driver or a hazardous situation the police would appreciate being notified.
- 4. The police suggested notifying them rather than stopping to render assitance to disabled motorist as there have been reported incidents of police impersonation. Always ask for a picture id and badge if they state they are policemen.
- 5. Custom officers have unmarked cars.
- Pima County Sheriff Department has jurisdiction if you are not an Indian and commit a violation off of the highway.
- Department of Public Safety and Reservation police have jurisdiction if you are not an Indian and commit a highwy violation.
- Reservation police have a "Ride-a-long" program and welcome our participation. If you are interested, please contact Lt. Encinas at Sells.
- We were also advised against confronting individuals on the reservation.
- 10. Remember if you require assistance from the police, the area covered by the officers is 14000 to 17000 sq. miles. The area is nearly the size of the state of Connecticut. Please give them time to respond if your are in trouble.

The July Board meeting will meet on Tuesday, July 11th at a time and place to be announced.



Folks from Phoenix, Tucson and Cholla treat yourself to a fun weekend with your friends and cool off from the summer heat. Let's have some fun.





MEXICAN AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE

The Lewis and Lewis Insurance Agency has arranged a special group policy for your organization which allows you to have an actual policy in your possession at all times and not a credit card which might not be acceptable to certain local authorities in Mexico. In fact our office used to issue credit cards some 20 years ago but we found that the credit cards were not acceptable and in fact landed one of our insureds in jail for an overnight stay until we were able to prove that a policy was in force.

We can provide an Automobile Liability Policy for the entire year at a cost of $\underline{\text{ONLY}}$ \$60.00. This coverage applies to Baja California North and South, Sonora and Sinaloa.

In addition to the Liability Only we can provide a Mexican Full Coverage Policy which covers Collision, Fire, Total Theft, Glass Coverage, Liability \$25,000 Property Damage, Bodily Injury \$30,000 per person/\$60,000 per accident, and Medical Payments in the amount of \$2,000 per person/\$10,000 per accident. Full coverage includes liability and there would be no need to have an additional \$60.00 added to the below listed premiums.

For members who own or lease residences or have trailers or condos in Mexico, we have a package available very similar to the U.S. Homeowner's Policy. 




