



Mexican Independence Day

"Long live our Lady of Guadalupe! Down with bad government! Death to all Spaniards!"


This is the famous grito, or cry for freedom. These words spoken by Padre Hidalgo in the tiny village of Dolores (about 100 miles north of Mexico City) on September 16, 1810, marked the beginning of Mexico's quest for independence from Spain.

As Mexico begins to celebrate her Independence Day on September 16, it is interesting to look at how this revolution began - without plan, without policy, and practically without weapons. There would be many years of bitter battles before the people of Mexico realized their dream of independence from Spain, and the role that Father Hidalgo played on this historic day is an interesting part of Mexican history.

Padre Hidalgo was a strong-willed Catholic priest who had earned a reputation as a problem due to his liberal political and social views. From his parish in Dolores, he observed the oppressive condition of the poor in New Spain. Padre Hidalgo shared his "liberal" ideas with a small group who became the Queretaro Literary Club. The government began to see the group as dangerous conspirators and planned raids on the group. Padre Hidalgo was shocked at the overreaction to the peaceful and moderate plans of the club. The government reaction forced this group to embark on a course of armed defiance against the police and the army. On September 16, 1810, Padre Hidalgo called together his people, and with his grito the move for independence began.

Padre Hidalgo lead his people in this revolt until March 21, 1811, when he was captured near the village of Mondova at the battle of Calderon Bridge. He was taken to Mexico City and tried and found guilty of treason for his part in the revolt. He was defrocked and shot on July 30. His head was taken back to Guanajuato (the place of his groups first victory), where it was impaled on an iron hook and remained for 10 years.

The death of these first leaders did not, however, stop the revolution. New leaders rose to replace those that had been captured and executed. Padre Jose Morelos lead the fight after the death of Hidalgo while working out a plan to reorganize the government. Padre Morelos was captured in October 1815 and quietly executed December 22, 1815. The desire for independence continued after the death of these two men, and Mexico was declared an independent nation in 1821.

AN INTERESTING ANTICDOTE ON BIRD ISLAND

Our retired Army Brigadier General Theodore Haardt in residence at my brother's Tres Brisas Ranch in Camp Verde Arizona told us this interesting story about our area in Sonora Mexico.

12 days before December 7, 1941 a diplomatic courier with his briefcase locked on his wrist stopped at Fort Rosecrans near San Diego and informed the commanding officer that the Japanese were on their way to attack Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

About 2 months after the Pearl Harbor attack the war and Navy Department was worried that Japanese submarines or surface ships would come up the Gulf of California and attack the U.S.A. from Mexico.

The Colonel in charge of Fort Rosecrans was extremly ambitious, Col. Addison who was looking for a 'star' and would do anything for extra attention.

Col. Addison ordered then Major Haardt adjudent in charge of Fort Roscrans to place a detachment of soldiers on San Jorge Island (Bird Island) in the Gulf of California.

Major Haardt left San Diego with his detachment of 15 men with three or four boats in tow behind Army trucks and headed for Tijuana Mexico. From Tijuana they headed east on the only dirt road to Sonora from Baja Norte.

The convoy traveled 500 miles to Puerto Penasco camping along the way for three or four days and nights.

the group launched at Puert Penasco and departed for Bird Island. Here Ted Supervised building a trail around the island. Remenants of this trail can still be seen today.

The detachment had sonar and other listening devices. The group claimed they saw one submarine.

To keep away boredom the recruits did practice shooting and almost shot themselves!

Ted went back to Fort Roscrans got transferred before the detanchment got relieved and has wonderedto this day what happened to those boys.

SWIMMER'S EAR If someone you know

is prone to swimmer's ear, take the following precaution: Mix one part rubbing alcohol (dries the canal) and one part white vinegar (inhibits bacteria), and put several drops of the solution into each ear immediately after a swim and again two hours later. (Note: Do not use the solution if there is a tube in the ear for drainage or a hole in the eardrum.) Severe pain, impaired hearing, white or yellowish-green discharge from the ear, fever or swollen glands are all signs of a serious infection that should be treated with antibiotics.

BARBECUE BURN Immediately immerse the injured area in cold (but not icy) water or apply cool compresses until pain eases. (You may also use ice packs, but never put ice directly on a burn.) Do not apply butter. A better choice: a thin layer of antiseptic spray or ointment made specifically for burn treatment (check label). Cover the burn with a clean, dry bandage and change it daily. If blisters form, do not break them. However, if blisters break on their own, blot them dry and apply a sterile dressing. If the burn is severe or becomes infected, see your doctor.







In addition to the Liability Only we can provide a Mexican Full Coverage Policy which covers Collision, Fire, Total Theft, Glass Coverage, Liability \$25,000 Property Damage, Bodily Injury \$30,000 per person/\$60,000 per accident, and Medical Payments in the amount of \$2,000 per person/\$10,000 per accident. Full coverage includes liability and there would be no need to have an additional \$60.00 added to the below listed premiums.




SOMETIMES THE WORD ARRANGEMENT IN CHURCH BULLETINS IS HUMOROUS.




