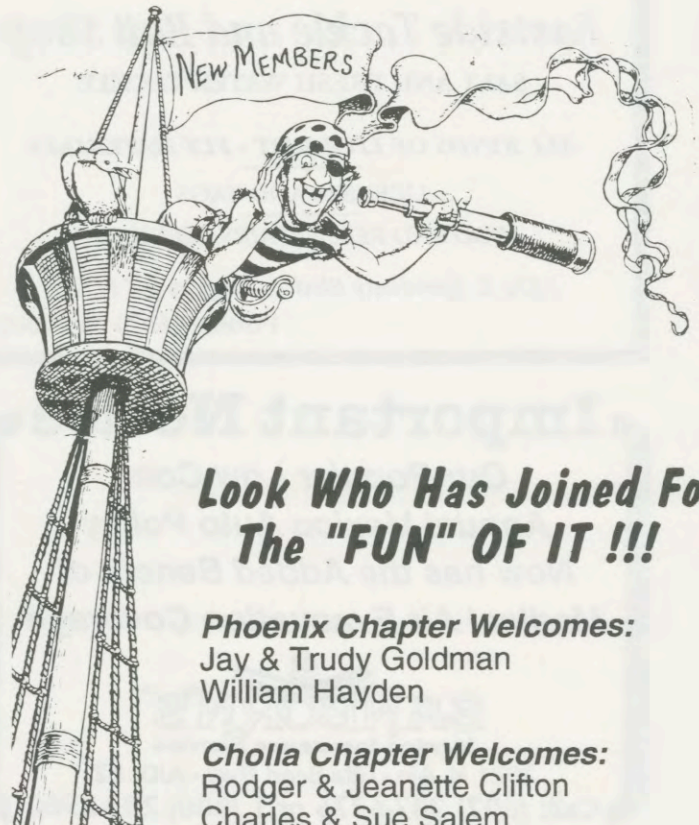

## Trip to Gillespie's Gold Mine

On the morning of November 25th 1994, 30 stalwart people in eight 4WD vehicles plus 3 ATV's departed from the Playa Elegante. Three dune buggies had left earlier. Our destination was the gold mine about 40 miles from Rocky Point. We had guest from British Columbia, San Diego and many parts of Arizona. The first stop was at La Pinta (second estuary) where we marveled at the narrow gauge locomotive and the remnants of a steel pier that was used by an English mining company. The steam engine was used to transport the rock from the mines in the area to boats which removed the ore. Also there were signs of the wooden pier the Spanish Conquistadors used to haul gold by burrows and enslaved natives the twelve miles from the mine to the ships. There are beautiful specimens of rocks in this area including pieces of turquoise, olivine, chriscola and quartz.

The next stop on the trip was halfway to the mine at the oasis where Bernard Gillespie had his small ranch complete with an orchard and garden. There is a deep well there that is still good but someone has removed the windmill. The old 1951 Studebaker is still there but has been striped of all valuable parts. The ore crusher and many other interesting objects were discovered along with a very large tarantula.

We finally arrived at the mine. There are two readily visible shafts, one is a horizontal shaft with a tunnel carved into the mountain and the second was a vertical shaft with a ladder along the wall of the shaft and water in the bottom. There were also several smaller mines, some of which were inhabited by bats. The horizontal shaft has two candles to mark the area where a cave in killed two young men in the 1970's. The area is filled with old mining equipment, fossils and colorful rocks, an explorers paradise.

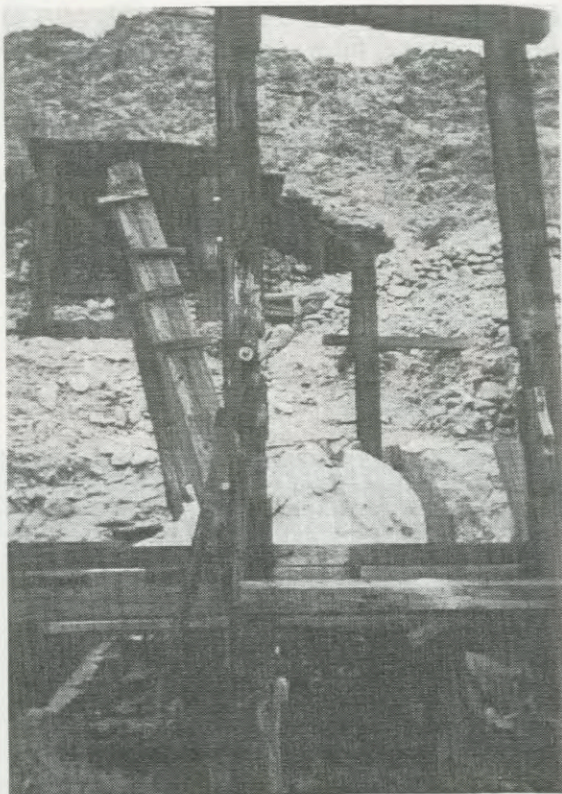
The return trip gave us a spectacular view of the most placid gulf, and a beautiful sunset.

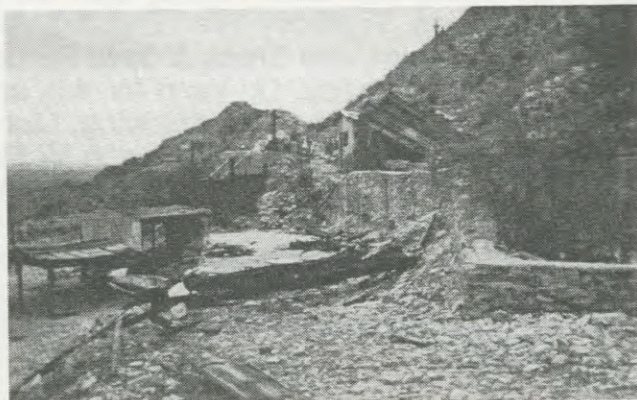

# Bottom Dwellers Active on Shallow Reefs

(part 2)

Hopefully the weather has settled by now down at the Bay. The waters of the upper gulf have "flipped over" and the water temperatures have stabilized. An unusual string of storms this fall has kept many boaters on the beach because of high winds and heavy seas, especially on the weekends. Things should be settled by early January giving four to five months of great bottom fishing.

As was stated in last months article the main key to successful bottom fishing near Cholla is finding the structure. Structure is rocks, caves, crevices, drop-offs, canyons, hills, mountains, wrecks and other debris on the bottom of the sea that attracts and has fish.

Most of the fish you will be seeking prefer this type of area for two major reasons. The smaller fish and the organisms they live on are the main diet of the larger fish. Both the smaller fish and the "Big Guys" use the reef for shelter. The caves and crevices act as homes for both and the sides of the structure also provides a rest area from the areas strong currents. One exception to this is the much sought after Halibut. The Halibut is found on sandy bottoms sometimes adjacent to the structure during the cooler months of the year.

So the first "secret" to being a successful bottom fisherman out of Cholla Bay is to know where the structures are. It's a big sea out there and the productive structures are hard to find if you don't know where to start looking.

The first couple of times out it would be wise to go with a friend who knows the area. Another alternative is to go out on a local charter or even better is to hire one of the better local guides to pilot your boat and assist you in rigging your gear.

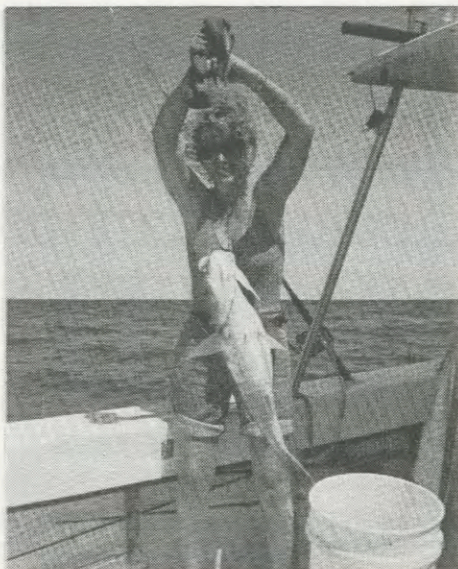
If you want to try strictly on your own there are various charts and maps you can obtain. The most recent book on the subject, and a very good reference is by Wally Schmerfeld "The Secrets of Super Grouper". Tide charts are also very important for planing a successful trip.

Once you find an active reef (structure) the fun begins. You should cruise over the area and determine (using your depth finder) the most likely spot to set up your drift pattern and then get ready for action.

Live bait or fresh dead is the most productive for this type of fishing. It should be caught on the way out to the reefs but almost always is available on the reefs too. Scampi jigs with or without bait strips are the next best. I'll elaborate more on both in the next issue.

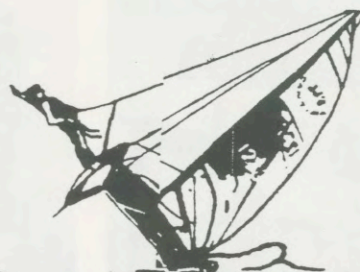
Get the bait to the bottom as quickly as possible then jig it up and down (on a tight line) 3-5 feet at a time. When you feel a strike don't worry about setting the hook just then, keep the line tight and keep the fishes head headed toward the surface. The first 10-20 feet are critical. You must get him up off the bottom as soon as possible so that he won't cut you off in the rocks or get back to his cave or crevice.

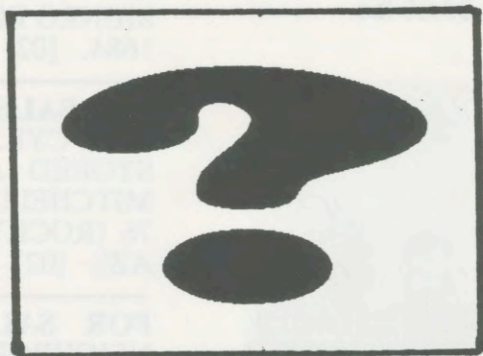

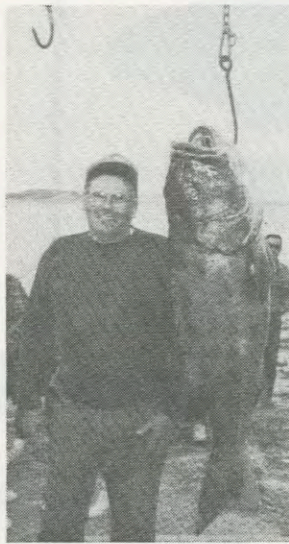
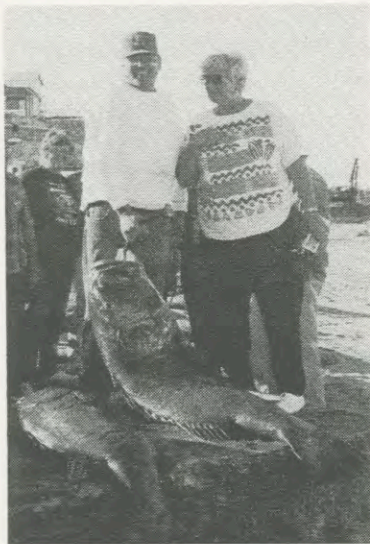




Mike Thorton proudly displays his 106 lb. Grouper, caught in October 94.

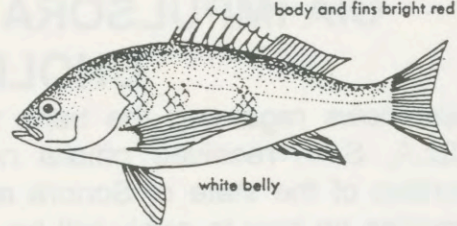


### Cortez Halibut (Lenguado)

A flat fish with both eyes on one side. Found throughout the Sea of Cortez both inshore and offshore. Dark brown above with 8-10 dark spots and a white underside. Prefers sandy bottoms. Takes drifted live or dead baits and small feathers. The mouth has a large single row of sharp teeth in each jaw. They average 3-5 lbs. but can get up to 25lbs. and are excellent eating

### Red Snapper ( Hauchinango)

The body and fins are bright red with a pink to white belly. They prefer deep water around 250 ft. and feed mainly at night. The average weight is 2-5lbs. but do get up to 15 lbs. Red Snapper take baits near the bottom and yo-yo'd jigs and are excellent eating.

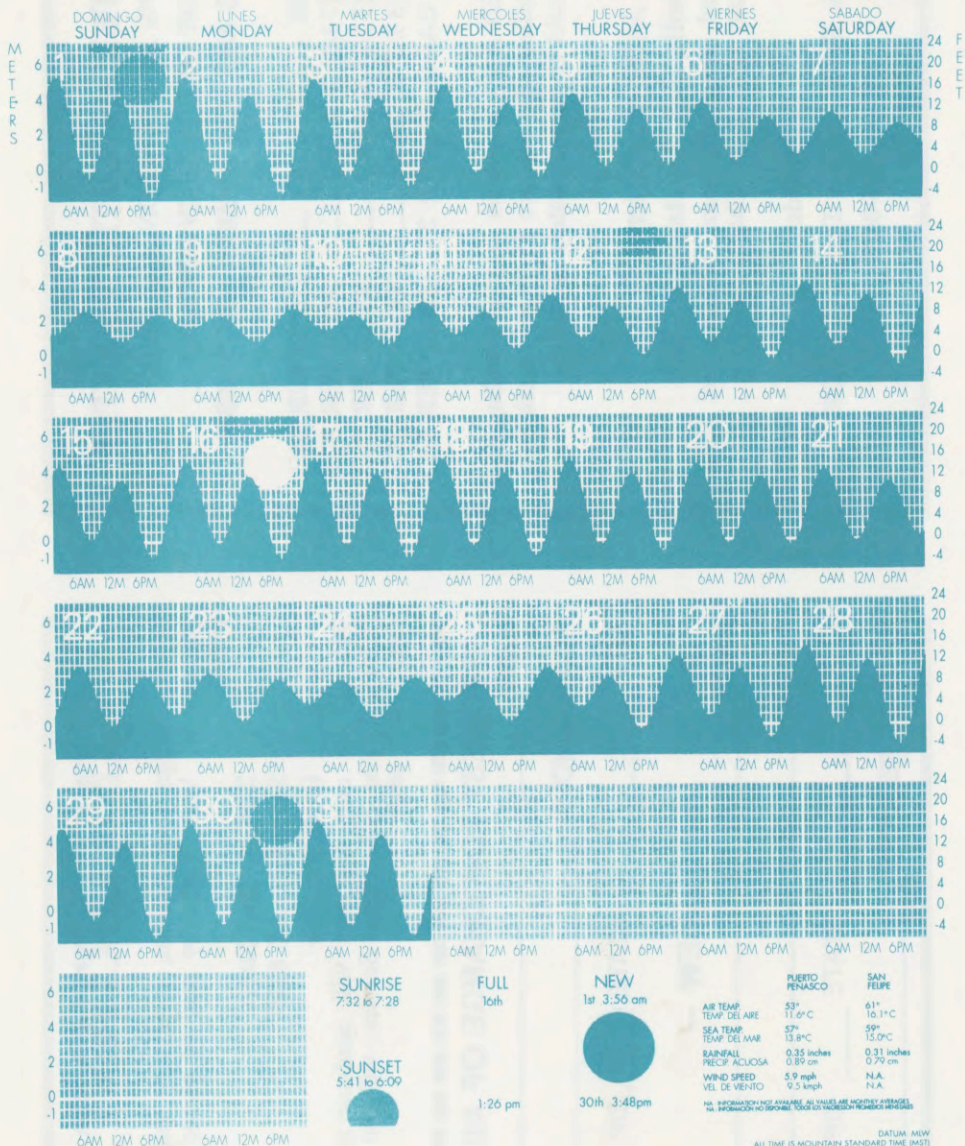
