Well, back to the meeting ... we didn't have a formal business meeting, we dismissed all reports so we could enjoy each others company. The gift exchange once again proved to be a success, you've never seen grown adults act like such kids. It was a lot of fun. We once again had our door prizes, and the winners were:

### BIRDING AT OUR CHOLLA

One of the things one first notices on a visit to Cholla Bay is the wildlife. The most obvious of the wildlife is birds. They are not bound by gravity to stay in one place, thus it is common to see Brown Pelicans fly past Pelican Point each day, listen to gulls fight over fish cleanings or watch a Sandpiper dance along the shoreline looking for crustaceans to eat.



Over this past Thanksgiving weekend, my friends, Noel Jordan, Karen Peitsmeyer and I birded pelican point and the salt marsh in the back bay of our Cholla. At Pelican Point we saw Brown Pelicans, Herring Gulls, Ringed Billed Gulls, Western Gulls, Yellow Footed Gulls. We also observed Willits (a kind of sandpiper), Sanderlings (kind of like a sandpiper) and Ruddy Turnstones.

Ruddy Turnstones spend their summers in the Arctic. As their name indicates they turn over stones to look for small marine animals which they eat. They are the same color as the low tide stones on Pelican Point, about the same size too. To see one, a sharp eye will first notice moving stones, then with closer inspection (binoculars are helpful) a 7 to 9 inch bird is revealed with a gray beak, orange legs and black breast.

High overhead on Pelican Point Magnificent Frigate Birds, numerous ducks in a "V" formation and the Sea Eagle or Osprey were sighted. Closer to the ground at Pelican Point, there were a pair of Western Meadowlarks, Great Tailed Grackles and Rock Wrens and at the feeder at the Jordan's home both a Magnificent Hummingbird and a Blue Chinned Hummingbird.

We traveled to the salt marsh at low tide. There we found Common Mergansers (a kind of Duck), Common Loons and Western Grebes. We saw numerous Great Blue Herons as well as beautiful white Great Egrets. In the scrub brush we saw Savannah Sparrows.

Out on the flats we saw American Avocets, Lesser Yellow Legs, a Whimbrel and many Long Billed Curlew. Long Billed Curlews live in the grassland of the northern plains states during the summer months. Here at Cholla Bay, they live in the salt marsh looking for insects and small aquatic animals with their long bill. They can seek out prey buried more than six inches deep with their bill. They are 21 to 26 inches long, with a very long down curved bill. They are brown and streaked above and buff colored underparts. As they fly they often call out their name "curlew, curlew".

During your next visit, enjoy the wildlife, I know I will.

### BUILDING FELLOWSHIP .... AND HOUSES FOR NEEDY FAMILIES IN PENASCO

If you were driving into Rocky Point on the weekend of November 10 thru 12, you may well have seen a campground filled with tents, campers, motorhomes, off to the west about five miles north and just beyond that nude (semi) lady that adorns the Curva Restaurant sign.

No, it was not a new trailer park. What you saw was a temporary home to many of the 260 Phoenix and Tucson area Church members that were here to build in one weekend, FIFTEEN homes for our most needy families...and they did it, with the help of local volunteers from Las Conchas and Cholla, all under the guidance of the local ministers council, and with the approval of Mexican Immigration.

The remarkable effort was an extension of similar programs being conducted in Tijuana and Juarez by Amor Ministries, based in San Diego. These people are a nondenominational, nonprofit group absolutely dedicated to helping the poor here in Mexico, by providing them with no cost homes, where in many cases they had been living in shacks, even abandoned old cars.

Amor channels the resources (labor, money, Christian fellowship) of Churches north of the border

and provides on site direction and coordination during the building effort.

The local Ministers choose the families to receive these homes based on need, on going financial

situation, while verifying that the family owns a small lot in our community.

The local volunteers pitch in and help where needed in building the Casa de Amor homes; and more importantly provide family support after the building effort --- making curtains, finishing doors, windows, even some furniture.

Perhaps the most rewarding aspect is the participation of the families themselves with the Church members. All hauling cement, framing, stuccoing together despite two different languages. The

families also finish the interior walls on their own to further their own pride in ownership.

With these fifteen, we now have 33 homes completed over the past year and a half. The next building effort is probably the most ambitious one yet -- maybe 22 more with younger, less experienced Church members on next February 16 thru 18. This is truly one of those rare deals, where everyone wins!!





## Tournament Fishing

It was a sunny afternoon, Oct. 15th, when Irma and I, along with our trusty crew of Ramon and Mikey, left from Rocky Point for Cabo San Lucas. Our mission was to fish two of the largest Marlin tournaments in the world, The Gold Cup, followed by The Bisbee, "The Worlds Richest Tournament".

On the trip down, we caught Dorado, Sailfish, Marlin and Wahoo. The weather was excellent and I managed to keep the M&M's semi-sober. What a job!

After we arrived in Cabo, our other fishermen started showing up with their wives. There was Rick "Poco Loco" and Pam. Tom "Super Tom" and Marianne, Clive, Conejo, Danny and Shawn, and last but not least Captain Dave. There seemed to be a divorce between Ramon and Mikey when Cindy (Mike's better half) arrived.

During the Gold Cup, we only had one catch and release. When the Marlin is caught and then released alive. Our luck wasn't very good, for on the last day of the tournament, we broke a shaft on the boat. It was a good thing that there was one day between the tournaments, because we had to take the boat out of the water to have it repaired. The "About Time" was ready to go that evening.

The first day of the Bisbee we were amazed at the 150 entrants in vessels large and small lining up for the 7:00 a.m. shotgun start. The VHF radios were silent as the countdown began. The gun fired and we were off in a cloud of black diesel smoke. All of the boats were running at full speed to reach their fishing spots eager to catch the big one for the money.


When we reached our destination, on the VHF the calls could be heard of the Marlin that were being caught around us. With all eyes faithfully on the poles, and over the water...nothing was seen all day. About 5:00 we headed back to port to get ready for the second day.

The second day started much like the first. Again, we reached our destination where the water was turquoise blue. About 10:00 a.m., Ramon spotted a Marlin about a quarter mile away. Headed in that direction the fish was spotted again. We waited a few minutes and the Marlin found our lures. Fisherman Super Tom got the hookup. 
The catch won a cool \$95,000, awarded to the crew of the "About Time" for the largest Marlin caught in the \$1,000 daily jackpot.
