Seasickness

Lots of folks suffer from that rotten stomach and dizziness associated with seasickness. Makes it difficult to even think about getting on a boat once you have experienced this nightmare. Recognizing the symptoms is the first step in **DOING** something about it! You really need to react quickly when it hits and not sit and suffer through it because it goes from bad to worse long before it gets better!

Symptoms:

1. Yawning and fatigue and then abnormal fatigue or lethargy.
 2. Stomach awareness (turns to nausea) and slight sweating. Face can go pale and your hands become cold/clammy. Mental tasks become difficult . . .
 3. The desire to lie down, die or give away whatever you have eaten in the last two years becomes overwhelming.
- Let's back up a little. Before boarding the boat, make sure you have eaten well. Never board the boat on an empty stomach! Carbohydrates are recommended consumption (pancakes, French toast or dry toast . . . yes, even the doughnut is recommended (Not greasy though, avoid **GREASY** and **SPICY** foods as much as possible). For the person who gets seasick, the brain says "Well, I'm gonna be sick and I don't want to eat something and give it away later." Conditioned thinking is going to set this into motion even before you get on the boat. As soon as symptom #2 begins to rear its ugly head, head for a soda cracker (preferably one without salt) and munch on those. If the body is compelled to go lay down and you just feel that is your only

recourse. Plant yourself on the section of the boat that is experiencing the least amount of rocking and pitching (most people look for a cabin and a bed). Stabilize your body, if you are in rough seas. Grab some pillows or a sleeping bag and surround yourself so the body doesn't violently rock with the boat (rocking doesn't benefit a queasy stomach in the least). Close your eyes to shut off some the mechanics in the brain. Sleeping does the same thing. When you're feeling even a little better, go on deck!

Focus your eyes on the horizon (try not to stare . . . have a look around a bit). Your brain and body are having some serious conflicts and this method helps to resolve those mixed messages in the brain. Position yourself on the part of the boat with the least amount of pitching either midship or aft. Try to stay in fresh air, avoid strong odors (Never stand downwind from an upchucking passenger, even the strongest stomachs turn at this situation!). Take slow deep breaths, don't read anything and have a soda cracker (salt free is recommended to slow down on dehydration), a small piece of hard candy or gingersnaps. Ginger is a good stomach settler. Ginger root capsules can be purchased in a health food store and can be consumed prior to meals. Ginger is also recommended for people who dive and can't take medication before a dive. If you are really bad off, force yourself to eat broth, toast or both on a large vessel for lunch. On a small craft a sandwich without greasy potato chips. Boaters can do their guests a real favor by having crackers or gingersnaps on board for short day trips. People that have little or no idea that they are

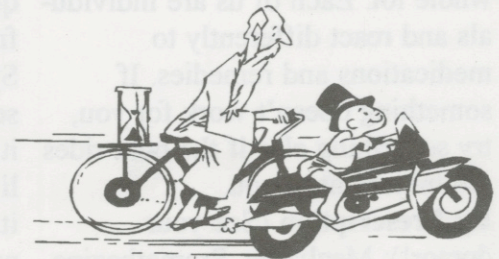

prone to get sick are pretty quiet about it and these two items on hand are a good back up. Getting them to eat is the biggest obstacle! Seasickness impairs judgement and the victim will refuse based on the previous conditioned thinking.

If you don't know whether you (or your children) get sick or not, try this: Sit in the back seat of a car and read a newspaper while the car is in motion. If this bothers you, you may be susceptible to motion sickness and should prepare prior to a boat trip. Seek out a physician and have some medical advice before you go . . .

Medications: Several are on the market and some don't help a whole lot. Each of us are individuals and react differently to medications and remedies. If something doesn't work for you, try something else if the boat rides are important to you.

By Prescription (See your doctor!): Meclizine, Promethazine, Cinnarizine or Dimenhydrinate . . . the patch behind the ear using Scopolamine has pretty much been discontinued in the US. Some very serious side effects have been identified, especially for older users. Side effects such as dryness of the mouth, disorientation and memory loss are the prevalent disadvantages. This is a horrific blow to older Americans that suddenly have the retirement time to take a cruise and are unable to combat the seasick situation because of this widely relied on patch (new patches are being explored though). This is also why they are so difficult to find.

Cruises are the #1 seasick contributors, the ship's ride is so smooth, that people that normally don't get sick on small vessels are experiencing this illness on large ships. Note: if you have been on a

cruise, you'll have noticed how frequently you were fed . . . seasickness is a huge problem.

Over the counter: Wrist bands work on accupressure points to relieve nausea (there are several brands available in your local drugstore but keep in mind that these don't work for everybody), Dramamine, Antevvert or Bonine can all be bought over the counter but can cause drowsiness (not recommended for divers). Some of today's popular brand-name remedies are actually Meclizine in non-prescription strength. Check the ingredients if you find one that works. You can buy generic Meclizine in the 25mg dose in quantities of 100 over the counter from your pharmacist.

Symptom #3: Well, let's say your seasickness came on really fast and it got out of hand before you felt like you could do something about it. You need to replace some nutrients to the body even if your body is going to dispel it later. The body will benefit from some of this replacement (force yourself to eat and drink but avoid alcohol). Excessive dispersement of body fluids leads to dehydration, weakness, drowsiness and apathy results. Several episodes lead to confusion, and eventually an incapacity to do anything. This is really an unfortunate situation if you have spent thousands for a trip and you are laying in a bed incapable of lifting your head. This is why it is so important to deal with this problem while planning your trip on dry land and before you board the boat.

Just to perplex the masses, lots of people don't get sick on wave runners and skidoos. Why is that? Well, the last piece of advice goes like this . . . stay busy! When riding a small craft, the mind is busy watching water conditions, steering, accelerating and using the brain for concentrating on others in the water. The brain is actively focusing. Similar to driving a car but riding in the car is different. While riding, the brain is passive and doing checks on how it "feels" constantly. Concentrating purely on the body because it is not distracted from listening to itself. If you feel some of this coming on, drive the boat for awhile. Also, on the water toys, you are constantly getting fresh air, the other deterrent for the ills!

As a final thought: Seasickness is an ugly day on the boat. The person is suffering. It's not something you just "get over". For those that don't get sick, serve up a little compassion and offer some assistance or understanding when someone doesn't want to go on the boatride. Especially children. They are more prone to remain silent and not disappoint a parent that wants to go.

Shopping for Shrimp?

1. Color is important, excessive black means extensive period of sitting around. Blackening of the shrimp is common and a pinkish orange color. The pinkish orange shell is the visual flag to be aware of mushy meat.
2. Take a moment to smell the shrimp. A sure sign of shrimp sitting too long on the dock is the smell. Less odor, the fresher the shrimp
3. Deal with the shrimp as soon as possible. Within 24 hours if at all possible. Anyone who has left the shrimp (legs and shells) in the garbage in the house can attest to the decomposition smell emanating from the garbage. Shrimp really don't have much of a shelf life in the cooler even on ice.
4. Clean and freeze as quickly as possible if you have the means. It is far better to shell and devein, than freeze with the shell and vein still in.
5. Always wash well after shelling and deveining prior to freezing.
6. Ask any unfamiliar guests if they have an allergy to shell fish, you'd be surprised what a heartache you can avoid by just asking. Never cook something else in the shrimp boil pan without cleaning thoroughly if you do have a guest in the house with a shellfish allergy. Shrimp do leave a toxic residue in the boil pan to a sensitive guest with allergies

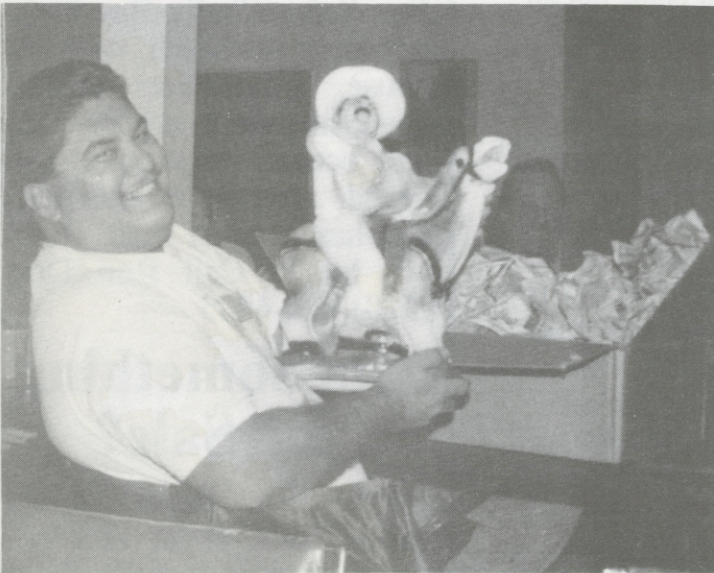

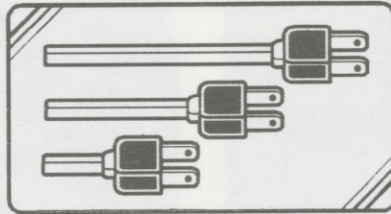
Letter to the Editor

COMMUNICATING IN CHOLLA BAY

In Cholla Bay we have power lines, but not power, and we have telephone lines, but not telephones. The power could be turned on for some people by the time you read this. The telephone service could be available early in 1999. In the meantime, if you have a Cellular One phone, you can call back to the USA or even Puerto Penasco.

To call Puerto Penasco, you just dial the five digit local number. If you have any problems, dial "*611" which is customer service. Sometimes your phone has to be "registered" with the Mobitel computer before you can make or receive calls.

A short lesson in cellular telephone systems. There are two carrier systems: Carrier "A" is Cellular One in Arizona and Mobitel in Puerto Penasco and the "B" carrier is



AirTouch in Arizona and Telecel in Puerto Penasco. The following techniques work on the A carrier. I have not had an opportunity to test them on the "B" carrier. For a long time you could dial "*288" to connect to AT&T and then use your AT&T calling card to place a call in the United States. "*288" doesn't seem to be working at the moment and I haven't found anyone that can explain the problem. Instead if you want to call the USA on your cell phone from Cholla Bay, You can dial 1*95 (area code) and the seven digit telephone number. The charges will come out on your cellular bill. Mobitel Customer Service also told me that if "1*95" didn't work, to try "1*00". I haven't tried the latter because the former works fine. Before you go to Mexico, call Cellular One Customer Service and make sure your service is configured to work in Mexico. If you have a Cellular One phone and someone calls your cell phone in Arizona, the call will follow you and your phone will ring in Mexico. Of course you will be paying Cellular One, an international call and Mobitel. The cost per minute is between three and four dollars. This is a dynamic situation and I will try to keep you informed of changes as I learn of them. 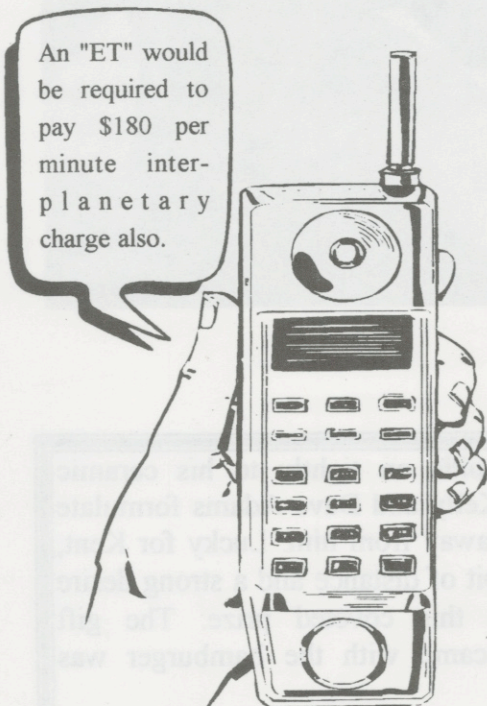

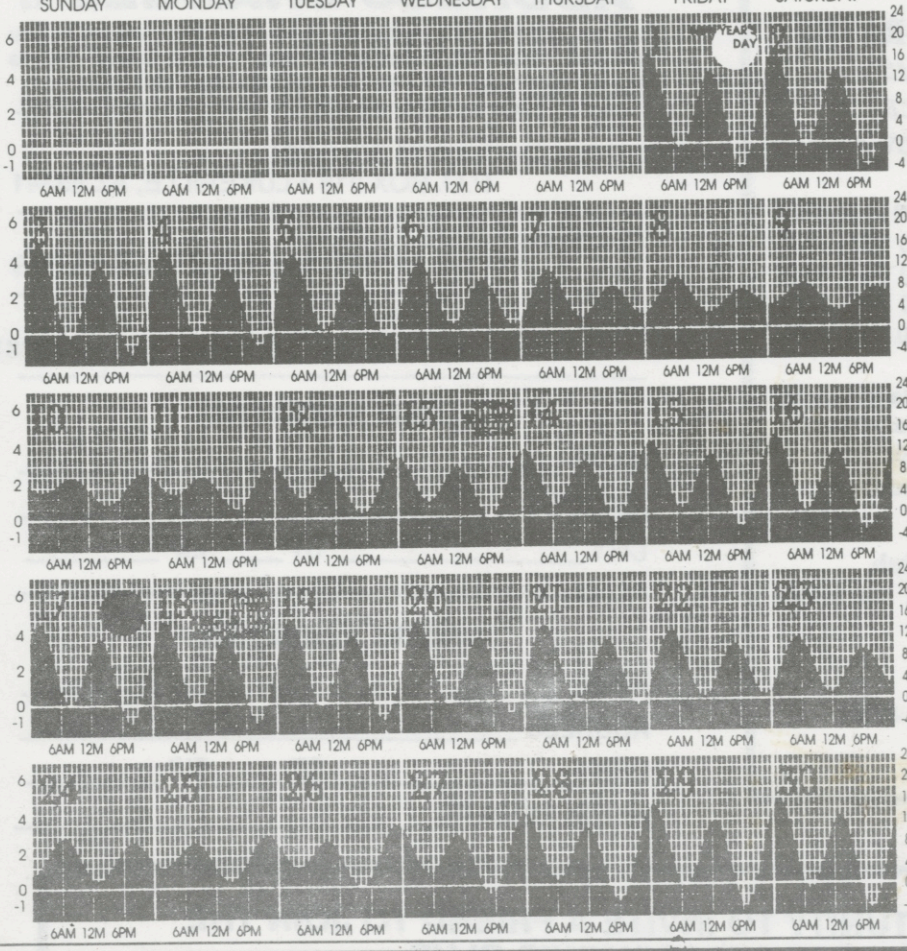
