

C.B.S.C. MAKES SOUP





When Hurricane Nora blew through Puerto Peñasco in September 1997, my intake of margaritas this time, one of the areas that sustained the most damage was Colonia Nueva. and therefore got through the min-This is a barrio (neighborhood) North of Cholla Road in the area of the utes OK. I'm still looking for newly paved boulevard. Many people in the area didn't have electricity. These poor people made their houses from drywall and whatever materials they could find. Over 400 homes were damaged, most completely blown over. As the storm was leaving, Alan and Connie White drove into the area and started doing whatever they could to help the people.

Today the houses have been rebuilt, some stronger, and the quality of life in Colonia Nueva has improved. The Whites call their ministry to these

people, Esperanza de Vida (Hope of Life). Every Saturday members of Iglesia Evangelica Neuvo Nacimiento teach Bible classes to the people of the area. There are now three classes for different age groups of children and an adult class. After the classes, refreshments are served. This consists of soup or something warm in the winter, sometimes hot dogs, and fruit in the warmer months. Consistently, 150 to 200 people attend this activity that starts at 4:00 pm every Saturday. Because of this effort, the mistrust of neighbors has been replaced by a strong sense of community.

The Saturday group meets in the yards of several residents. There are discussion underway about buying a lot and building a Community Center to house the various activities during the week as well as Saturday. When a lot is purchased, all types of building materials will be needed. Many visitors and local resident help in this

effort by donating money, their time and / or bringing

down supplies for the Saturday program.



During the week, the Whites help meet the needs of these people by transporting them to hospitals and doctors, supplying food for those that have little or nothing, distributing donated clothing and various other types of assistance. They have been very effective in helping these people because they have taken the time to build relationships. 




