



American Sportfishing Association to expand tackle loan program

PHOENIX---Designed to put rods, reels and terminal tackle into the hands of those who might not otherwise have the opportunity to go fishing, an innovative Sportfishing Loaner Program will expand to key western cities over

the next two years.

Through the efforts of its Sportfishing Promotion Council, the American Sportfishing Association is hoping to have its loaner program operational in 374 locations nationwide by mid-1997. Primarily intended to be based out of public libraries, other potential distribution sites for loaner tackle include state parks, recreation centers and retail stores. Local fishing clubs maintain the equipment in good working order, ASA officials point out.

Phoenix is one of two large cities that the council is studying for immediate expansion of the rod and reel loaner program. Also being targeted are San Francisco, San Diego,

Denver and Seattle.

ARIZONA'S MOST COMPLETE SALT WATER. FRESH WATER



Those who enjoy using fly rods in fresh water will find never-ending excitement with similar tackle in saltwater. Nearly every species from panfish size to giant Marlin can be taken on wet flies or popping bugs, if one knows how. Some require extreme finesse in casting, presentation, hooking and handling, plus a little bit of Lady Luck. Others can be caught easily by even the most novice fly fishermen by just drifting a fly in the current.

The tackle used for fly fishing on freshwater lakes and streams should be adequate, if there is ample backing on the reel. However, a medium to slow-action fiberglass rod about 9 feet long would handle the greatest variety of saltwater species. This rod should take a size 9 or 10 line with a forward taper. If the reel has an extra spool, two lines are better than one - a floating line for fishing

poppers and a sinking line for deep work. Deep meaning 6 feet or more.

The reel need not be expensive, as long as it has a smooth drag to handle long, fast runs. For this reason at least 150 yards of backing, testing about 20 pounds, should be included. There are many

saltwater fish that can easily take all of this line and still keep going.

Leaders are less of a problem in salt water than fresh, although in slack water they should roll out properly when presenting the fly. A leader no longer than the rod is excellent for surface and near-surface fishing, and a shorter one adequate when going deeper. Fine tapers are undesirable because few species of saltwater fish are leader shy, and tapers to about 10-12 pounds are more suitable to the relatively large hooks on which most saltwater flies are dressed. Short shock leaders or wire traces are used when sharp-teethed fish or those having cutting gill covers might be hooked.

Bucktail flies simulate baitfish and are useful for many saltwater species. Some, such as bonefish, may prefer shrimp imitations. In general, saltwater flies are simple unnamed bucktails or streamers of a size and general coloration simulating the bait on which the fish seem to be feeding on at the time. Stainless steel or plated hooks are better than freshwater hooks made of carbon steel; the carbon hooks will rust or weaken quickly. Hooks vary in size or weight depending on the speed of sinking desired as well as the size of the fish being sought. All white streamers or bucktails are very popular, and it helps to add a little glitter, such as thin strips of mylar. Red, blue, or yellow often are laid over the white, and a combination of red and yellow is also good.

Anglers used to inland freshwater fishing (matching the hatch, delicate presentation, and all that) will find most saltwater situations easier. As just noted saltwater flies are simple ones compared to the complicated choices used in freshwater. They can be slapped down on the surface and often


attract more strikes that way.

Next time you head to your favorite seaside destination pack along your fly rod. Once there, wade out a ways and start casting, you just might be surprised at the size and strength of saltwater fish on

a fly rod.

FREEZING AND DEFROSTING FISH

- 1. Depending on the species, bleed or gut the fish soon after it is caught. Most experts agree that leaving the head on the fish improves the flavor. Bleeding can be done by cutting the throat of the fish to the backbone, then making a second slice at the base of the tail.
- 2. Immediately place the fish on a bed of crushed ice after bleeding or gutting. Do not pack the fish under a layer of heavy ice, it could damage the flesh.
- 3. After returning to the dock, or after the fish has stiffened, fillet or steak-out the fish. Leaving the skin on the fish will better protect it during the freezing process.
- 4. Package the fish so as to minimize exposure of flesh to air. This can be done with a vacuum-sealer or by dunking the bagged fish in a bucket of water, which forces the air to the top of the bag so it can be sealed with the least amount of air possible. Another way to protect the fish is to freeze it in a heavy plastic bag or small container filled with water.
- **5**. Freeze quickly by placing the fish directly on the freezing surface of your freezer. Store the fillets or steaks at a constant temperature of zero degrees Fahrenheit or colder. Bypassing some of these rules won't ruin the fish, but it will shorten its shelf life.

Defrosting:

Frozen fish deteriorates as it ages, but there are ways to improve the flavor. Always remove the skin and trim off any dry or off-color meat. Some of the strong flavor can be removed by soaking the trimmed meat in salt water, diluted vinegar water, marinade or milk. Smoking the fish using a dry or wet process also improves its flavor. Fish that's smoked even after spending several months in the freezer will taste almost as good as fresh smoked fish.

Fish should be thawed slowly and placed in a refrigerator before it is completely thawed. If it has been frozen in ice, it should be left on a counter at room temperature until most of the ice has thawed, then put in the refrigerator. Thawing in water will rob some flavor, while thawing it in a microwave may slightly cook the surface. Use a microwave as a last resort if you need to thaw the fish quickly.

Here is an example of how to prepare a frozen fish meal. First place the fillet on a cutting board skin side down. Using a sharp knife, carefully trim off any dry or discolored flesh. Next carefully cut the skin away, then trim off all the dark meat that was under the skin.

It is best to marinade any fish that has been frozen for a long time. Marinades can be used before cooking or prior to smoking, and restores moisture to the surface while adding flavor. Marinate the fish in the refrigerator for 30 minutes, turning once in the middle of the process. Now the fish is ready to be grilled or baked. As the fish is cooking brush on the extra marinade. Remember that bacteria from raw fish are transferred to the used marinade and may make the fish unsafe to eat if used late in the cooking process.

A simple, delicious marinade can be made by combining the following ingredients:

3 Tbs. lemon juice

1 Tbs. soy sauce

1/2 Tbs. Worcestershire sauce

1 Tbs. olive oil (or cooking oil)

1 clove garlic smashed once to release flavor

1 tsp. dill

Ground black pepper

As your frozen fish approaches the end of its shelf life, you can alter your preparation methods to produce a very appealing meal. However, the best way to always have good, fresh-tasting fish is to bleed and cool it soon after it is caught, package it properly and freeze it quickly. Take care of your fish from the start and you'll have great-tasting fish dinners long after the fishing trip has ended.






