

COOK'S CORNER

MACADAMIA-COCONUT SHRIMP

1/8 tsp.salt

1/8 tsp. pepper

 Ib. large shrimp, peeled, develoed, tails left on.

1 cup sweetened, flaked coconut

1/2 cup chopped roasted macadamia nuts

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 egg, lightly beaten


2/3 cup guava or apricot preserves

1 TBS fresh lime juice

1 TBS sov sauce

1/8 tsp. hot pepper sauce

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Place rack coated with cooking spray on jelly roll pan. Sprinkle salt and pepper on shrimp.
Combine coconut and nuts. Coat shrimp with flour; dip in egg, then nut mixture.
Place on rack. Bake, turning once, until opaque, 6 minutes per side. Heat remaining ingredients together until melted, to be used as a dip for the shrimp.

HEART ATTACKS - continued from above

HEALTH HINT

THIS SOUNDS LIKE SOMETHING WE SHOULD ALL

BE AWARE OF.!

Women should also know that not every heart attack symptom is going to be the left arm hurting. Be aware of intense pain in the jaw line. You may never have the first chest pain during the course of a heart attack.

Nausea and intense sweating are also common symptoms. 60% of people who have a heart attack while they are asleep do not wake up.

The pain in the jaw happened to the writer of the email and woke her from a sound sleep. She explained it as a pain unlike anything she had ever experienced before. (cont'd below)



Let's say it's 6:15 and you're driving home alone after a hard day on the job. You're tired, upset and frustrated. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to radiate out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five miles from the hospital nearest your home. Unfortunately you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.

HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE:

Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest.

A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital.

Tell as many people as possible about this. It could save their lives.

Pat Goodin turned on the red light in both of these instances, for which Villa is very grateful. He didn't know where to turn it on prior to this. This light is very helpful to boats coming in at night.

Villa tells me he is really enjoying his job as radio operator and heading up search and rescue missions. Thanks, Villa!

Yes, you heard correctly. Almost at the last moment, Mike and Cathy Traverse along with Brad Moen came on board to rescue the 51st annual CBSC Fishing Derby. It will be a five day event, starting fishing Wednesday, May 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and until noon on Sunday, May 28th. So, all you fisherpersons, get your boats and fishing gear ready for this year's Derby!

There will be adult and junior categories with both boat and shore fishing. The entry fee for all five days is \$20 for adults and \$10 for juniors. (smokin' deal!) You may pay this entry fee and purchase a fishing license and boat permit at the radio shack. Villa will have the person selling licenses there for the Derby. The license is not necessary for shore fishing. All species of fish may be taken except those prohibited by the Mexican fishing law. Mike is at present, revising the rules and regulations, so these will be available at the radio shack when they are finalized. Boat fishermen may purchase gas at J.J.'s pumps in Cholla.

The fish fry and awards ceremony will begin at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. Otañez and O'Callaghans of the Tucson Chapter will prepare the fish fry. Ramon Perez will purchase the fish. This has been the way it has been done the past few years rather than donations from the fishing contestants. This way we are sure of having enough fish. Vasquez will set up a cantina and CBSC will provide soft drinks and beer.

Dave and Kelley Adams have designed and ordered the derby shirts which will be on sale a Ship's Store as soon as we get them, probably the first week in May. Because of the shortness of time, the number of derby shirts for this year will be limited so you will need to get yours early, in order to get the correct sizes.

We have raffle tickets available now, a book of 6 for \$5.00. You can purchase these from Goodins, 382 5056, or Schmidlis, 382 5036. There was just not enough time to mail these to members. Of course these will be sold during the Derby at Ship's Store. Permits for the Derby and printing of raffle tickets have been taken care of by Pete Peterson.



From chairmen, Mike and Brad

Hello Fellow Fisherpersons.

It's time again for our annual fishing derby. This year being the 51st Annual CBSC Fishing Derby. It has gotten off to a late start due to some conflicts with a certain fish category. Regardless, we are still moving forward and keeping the tradition alive. Because of this issue, we are having the derby the week of Wednesday, May 24th to Sunday May 28th with the scales closing at 12:00 pm on Sunday. Of course the Fish Fry and Awards Ceremony will be that same day at 4:00 pm.

The rules and regulations for this year's derby is going to mirror the past years concerning weights of the various fish categories. Villa has reassured us that there will be someone at the scales to assist with fishing licenses and boat registrations.

The awards this year will differ slightly. The first place winners of the Adult Boaters and Surfcasters, including the Junior Boaters and Surfcasters will receive a plaque and fishing reel/rod combo. Second and third places will receive Rosette Ribbons for their placement.

It's important that you read the rules and regulation in reference to "Target Fish" because they will be worth extra points. Because we use the points system for the first three places (ie. $1^{st} - 10$ points, $2^{nd} - 8$ points and $3^{rd} - 6$ points) this would help a fisherperson gain a lead to obtain the title "All Around Fisherperson".

I have been told that the gas pumps at JJ's will be open for those participating in this year's derby, this will benefit those who will be out daily fishing.

The cost of this year's entry into the derby will be \$20 for adults and \$10 for juniors.

In closing, I'm looking forward to seeing everyone down at the bay and good luck to those who are fishing in this year's Annual CBSC Fishing Derby.
