


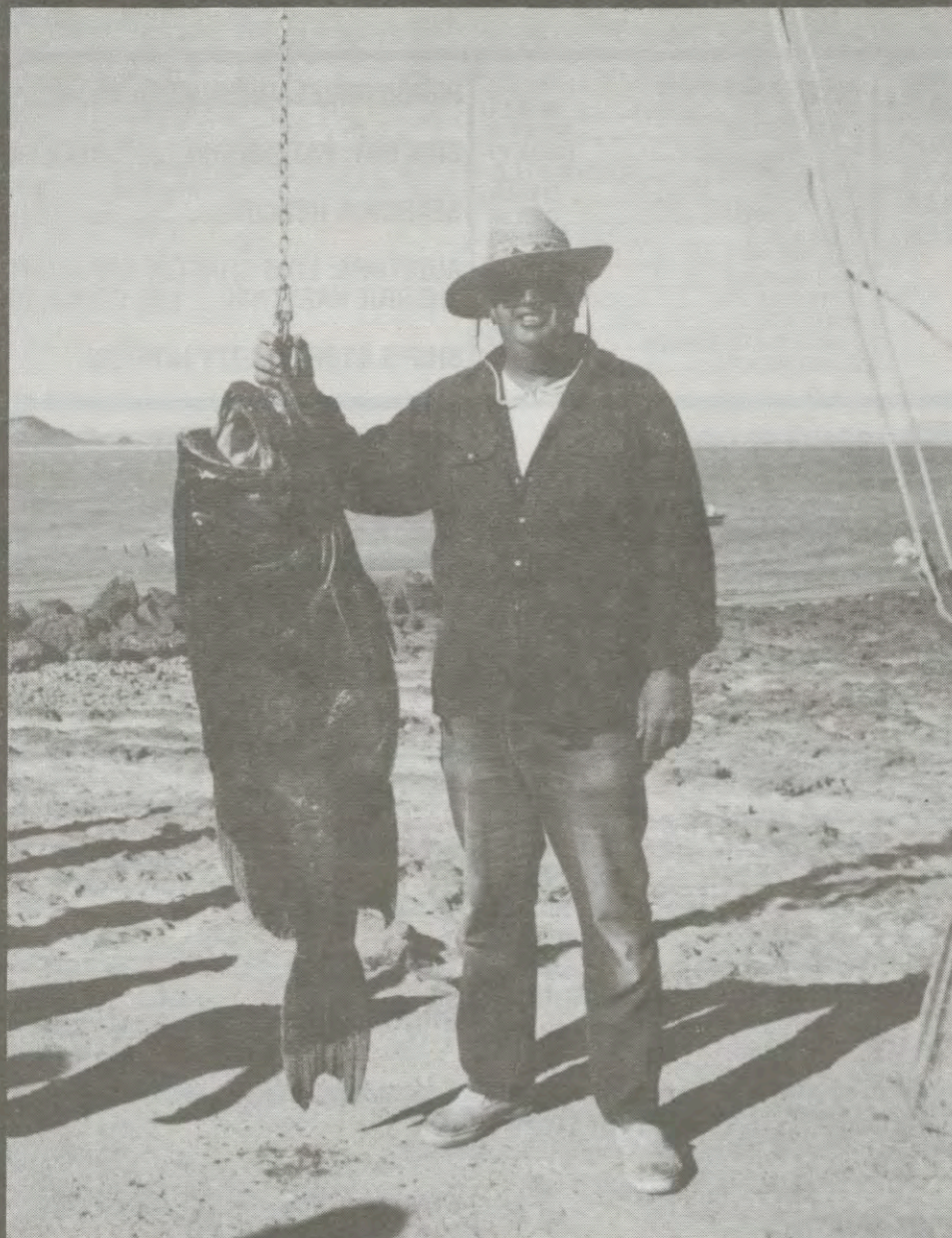

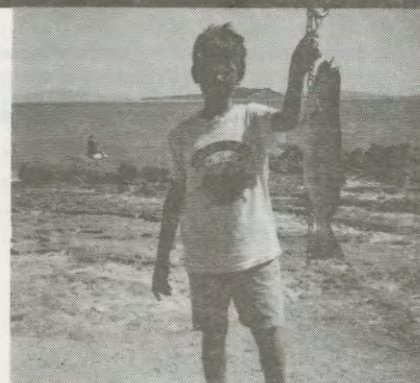

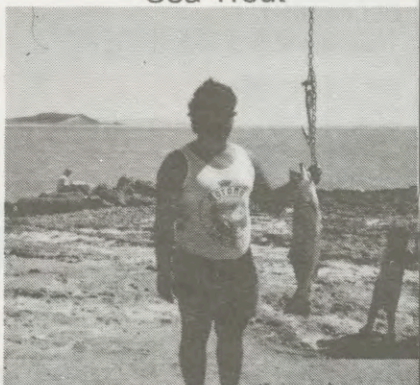
Bob Fleetwood's 87.55 lb Grouper taken on the first weekend of the Derby

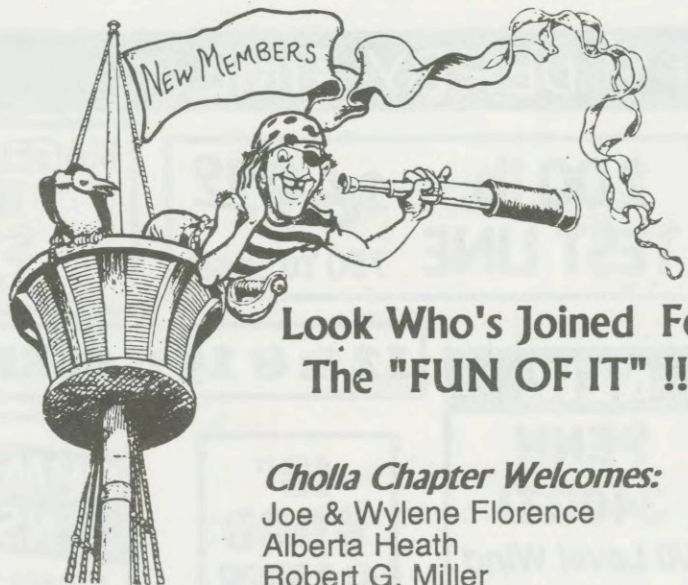

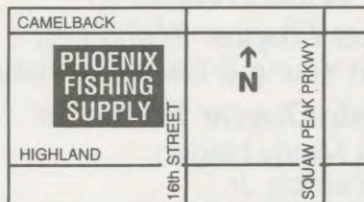

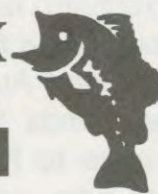

FIRST PHASE FISHING DERBY UPDATE

Friday the 21st.... The boats were ready, the fisherman arrived early at 5:30 a.m., but the wind blew and no boats were launched. Augustine said it was too dangerous to go out. A few fish were brought in from shore casters, so the die hards still had fun! A 2.35 lb. sea trout lead after the first day, caught by Dean Fisher, and qualifies for big fish of the day award worth two free dinners at a local restaurant.

Saturday the 22nd.... The wind was a little better, earlier in the morning, so by mid-day 44 boats had launched in spite of the Cholla Bay home owners meeting (being held in town). The 40th Derby was under way and as boats came into the white capped Bay in mid afternoon, many had no catches to report, they all said how rough it was to be out their fishing! But then about 4:30, in came "Water Gator" (Captain Mike Thorton) from the North Shore Boys of Playa Del Oro trailer park, with a big smile on his face! His fishing buddies "Mud Dobber" (Art Moore) and "Alpha 1" (Bob Fleetwood) yanked up a big grouper off the boats cockpit floor taken by "Alpha 1" and it weighted in 87 lbs. It took the lead in the Derby and the days big fish award worth two free dinners at Lily's Restaurant near the fish market in Old Town looking out on the Sea of Cortez.

Sunday the 23rd.... Brought more wind, but word was out about the big grouper that had been caught! Water Gator and crew launched early as usual and not far behind, Swamp Frog, Courtship II, Rambler, Tres Dorados, K.J., and several other boats. The winds grew stronger again but they all stayed out. Mid morning found Derby co-chairman Dave Adams and family and friends shore fishing off the rocks and the Sea Trout started hitting. By 10:30 a.m. all seven of them were at the scales weighting in their catch. Juniors Krystal Moen (11yrs old) had a 2.85 trout and Randy Adams (9 yrs old) with a 3.50 trout to put him in the lead for the junior division at this time. Mom "Kelley Adams" (Chatter Editor) and Dad "Dave Adams" also weighed in very large 4 to 5 lb. sea trout. Cabin guest Brenda Anderson also weighed in a large trout, but was not entered in the Derby. But the big one came from their cabin guest "Poncho" (Frank Prieto-Phx. Chap. Sec.) a huge 6.20 lb., trout almost 30" long, to take first place so far in this division both from shore casting and from boat! That will be hard to beat!!

Many boats returned to the Bay early, tired, and by mid afternoon, most boats were in with just a few small fish. When Rambler returned, they weighed in a few Cotchi however Jr. angler, 15 yr old Jason Barlow had a 9.35 lb. Pinto, which pushed him into first place in the junior division. It was the the big fish of the day and he won two free dinners in town.

After the first phase of the Fishing Derby the first place leaders are:

Grouper: men's, Bob Fleetwood 87.55lbs

Pinto: men's, Terry Brown 12.35 / junior's, Jason Barlow 9.25

Cotchi: men's, Bud Demer 3.35 / women's, Marion Barlow 3.95

Mackerel: men's, Dirk Bottesch 1.10

Sea Trout: men's, Dave Adams 4.10 / women's, Kelley Adams 4.55 / juniors, Randy Adams 3.80

Pompano: Dean Fisher 1.15

Offshore: Men's, Frank Prieto 6.20 / women's, Kelley Adams 5.30 / junior, Krystal Moen 2.65

There are still a lot of categories wide open, so grab your fishing tackle and your family and come on down to Cholla Bay and be part of the CBSC 40th Annual Fishing Derby.

May brings the next two phases of the Derby May 5th, 6th and 7th, and then again on the 26th-29th Memorial Day weekend, so bring your tackle or rent it, you don't have to have a boat. Fish from shore with a one ounce castmaster or any other shiny lure and you can really have fun catching Sea Trout, Trigger (Cotchi), Pompano or Mackerel (Sierra) and Jr's, Rock Bass or any misc. fish! This is a real family affair and more fun than can be told.

Anyone wishing to purchase bait for the Derby can do so at Sunstate Seafood Company in Phoenix. They sell Mackerel in 50lb. cases @ 84¢ per lb. and frozen Squid 3lb. boxes, 36lb. case @ 65¢ per lb. The Squid and Mackerel will be sold only as bait for export to Mexico. Split a case with a buddy and cut the cost. Ask for Brenda Lewis and let her know you're with the CBSC.

Our Derby is open to everyone, Jr's are \$5.00 for the entire Derby, Adults \$8.00 for the weekend or \$20.00 for the whole Derby and when you enter the full Derby you get six free raffle tickets which could win you cash or some great prizes.

T-shirt sales were very brisk, with half the inventory almost gone. This years 6 color design seems to be selling like hot cakes. There are some very nice embroidered hats and polo shirts coming soon, but they are very limited, so check them out! Remember to get your shirts and other Derby merchandise early before it's all gone.

Black is Beautiful

On February 11, 1993 a nice day with no wind, Rick McMillan (Poco Loco), Wally Schmerfeld (Super Grouper) Art Moore (Mud Dobber) and myself Walt Horton (Walt's Whims) left Cholla Bay heading south for about 2 hours to search for Black Bass, or whatever. A GPS sounded it's alarm and we were there, ready for action. We had 24 oz. scampi's mostly red and a trailing hook with a 4lb. mackerel for bait. We used 6/0 Penn reels on Tuna stick rods using 200lb. test monofilament line. The depth of this spot was over 200ft. by our depth finders.

Our first drift nothing hooked up, so it was decided to anchor. Getting the 28ft. Skipjack anchored was a chore, but with all of the expertise aboard we finally were set.

With my leather belly strap and my shoulder harness, my bait was lowered. I just set down on an ice chest on the rear left side of the deck when all hell broke loose. A fish hit, jerked me off the ice chest over the stern of the boat with my arms at full length hanging on to my rod and reel. I asked Poco Loco to get another belly strap because the cup had torn clear off my belt. He changed belts for me and I said please help me get this pole tip up over my head. My adrenaline was flowing pretty fast by now, but felt a lot more confident instead of helpless as before. The fish went 3 directions for about 10 minutes. Finally he headed from aft to forward so I reeled hard and fast as possible. I know he was trying, but I prayed "don't get in the anchor". Finally the big Black broke water on the port side. Super Grouper and Mud Dobber both got a gaff in his mouth. These fish will twist real hard and fast so this is the crucial time for gaffers to keep from losing a prize catch. Their expertise made me the hero for this trip. Several big Groupers, Sardineros, Red Snappers, Pintos and other fish were caught but no other Blacks took our bait on this trip.

The trip home was welcomed to get my breath and muscles recuperated for the effort spent on this glorious fishing day.

The Cholla Bay scales showed 220lbs. This was my biggest fish yet. What a happy day for all of us aboard the Poco Loco. I owe all of my friends my thanks. A special thanks to "Kinky B" for sharing their fishing spot. Hopefully my next catch will be 300lbs. or over! Thanks to trailing hooks or this prize catch would have been another famous one that got away!


RESULTS OF THE BALLOT COUNT

1,100 POUND CABO BLUE MARLIN

SHATTERS RECORD

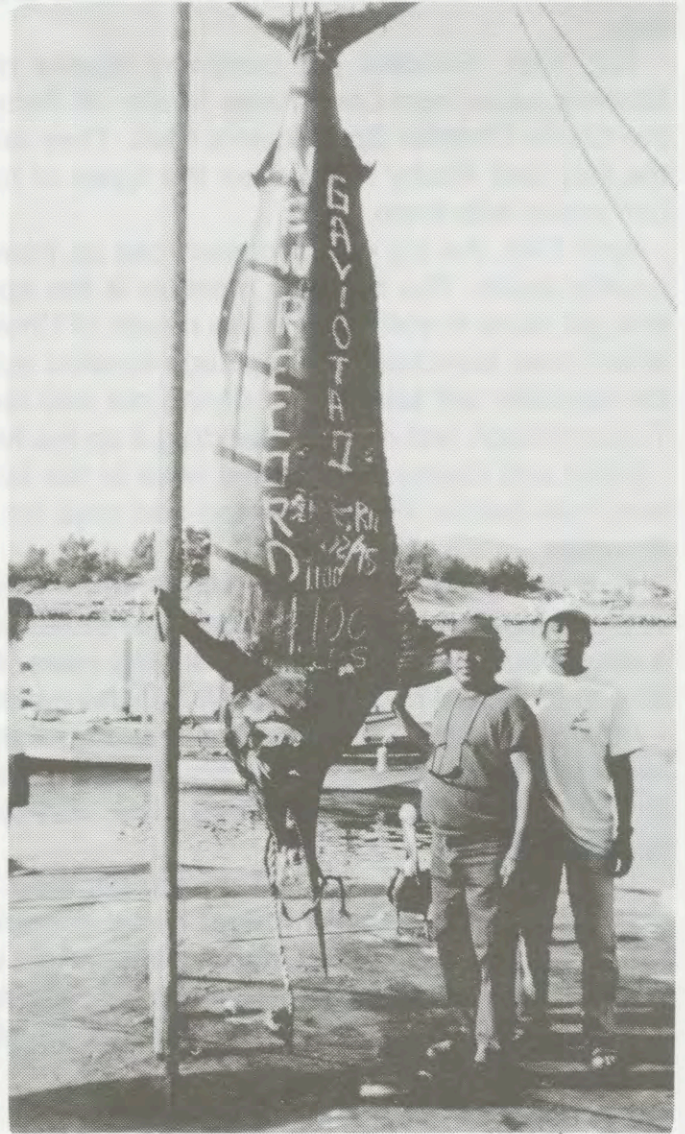
Sunday April 2nd, lucky anglers fishing for Yellowfin Tuna hooked into an 1,100 pound Blue Marlin that would put them into the Cabo record books. While 6 year old Michael Erin Stevenson was reeling in a Yellowfin Tuna that just hit a Tuna feather, the record Marlin engulfed the Tuna and the rod was passed off to his father Michael Stevenson who fought the fish for 35 minutes. The record Marlin was caught on a Penn 50 International with 60 pound Ande line and a Calstar Boomer Jr rod.

The fish was weighed in late Sunday afternoon. Crowds were small and word wasn't out in town until a few days after the feat. During the same week just two days later another monster Blue Marlin was weighed in at 595 pounds! This fish took two lines - a live bait and trolled lure and was reeled in on both rods.

Present conditions in Cabo are generally calm seas with occasional afternoon winds, water is in the low 70's and the air temp is a pleasant 85 degrees.

Yellowfin Tuna are showing well usually running with the Porpoise. Large bull Dorado to 50lbs. are being taken around the Gorda Banks area. Striped Marlin are also scattered around Gorda Banks, usually taking live bait. Rooster Fish are still biting good from Cabo on down to San Jose.
