Take a Kid Fishing


One of the greatest gifts with which an older person can endow a younger one is an appreciation of the fun of fishing. What kind of fishing? Any kind that's available that's not too difficult.

Pete & Shirley attended the wedding in Phoenix, April 6th of their daughter Lee.


Congratulations to the newly-weds.




If you've been to Cholla, you may have seen "Mr. Fish Taco". It is located on the main road into town, just past JJ's cantina, on the corner where they launch boats. It has a small kitchen and the tables are located outside. You can sit near the road and watch the traffic go by or sit at the tables that overlook the Bay. The food at this little place is excellent! My family and I have tried everything on the menu, and have never been disappointed. My husband says the Torta is the tastiest item on the menu. A torta is a type of sandwich, with seasoned shredded beef, lettuce, tomato, avocado all served on the sweet football shaped breads that are so good. I have a harder time picking my favorite dish. The fish tacos are fried fillets served on either soft corn or flour tortillas, with cabbage and lime, mmm. They also serve shrimp tacos this way. (Said to be the best in all the Rocky Point area). The Beef tacos are made with the shredded, seasoned beef and are fried, topped off with all the works. The menu has everything from bean burritos to fried shrimp platters and shrimp cocktails. The fresh chopped salsa is "muy bueno". The staff is extremely friendly they make everything fresh when you order. If you've never eaten here, give it a try, you won't be disappointed and I assure you that you will keep going back.

One of the things I love about Mexico is the food. I'm always looking for new and different places to eat. Congratulations to Grace Schooner for winning an award from the Archaeological Advisory Committee.



The Bimini Twist


Although it appears difficult, this knot can be completed in not over a minute after a little practice. While a post or something similar can be used to hold the loop, it is easier to let another person do it. The "Bimini Twist," or "Bimini Roll," is the formerly preferred way to double a line and retain nearly 100% of the strength of the unknotted one. It is used both in fresh and saltwater fishing to attach leaders, make shock tippets and to strengthen terminal tackle.

In the drawings the loop has been made small and the number of twist in the line has been reduced from the necessary 20 to keep the drawings from being too wide to fit the page.


1. Double the line to form a loop somewhat longer than what you intend to end up with. One person (B) should hold the end of the line. The other person (A), holding the loop end, proceeds to twist the loop 20 times by keeping his index finger in the loop and making circular motions with his wrist.




3. (B) should place his fore finger on the twist and bring the running end of the line towards the loop. As (A) continues to open the loop, the twist begins to rotate.




5. Now (B) must hold the wrap carefully to stop the rotation and at the same time execute a half hitch around the right base of the loop. (A) is still keeping the two lines of the loop separated.




7. To finish the knot off, a little clinch knot is tied about both lines of the loop at the base.




2. Once the 20 twist have been completed, separate the two strands of the loop (which will be much larger than illustrated) and working back towards the other end being held firmly by (B) to tighten the twist. Then (B) pulls the lines apart.




4. As the twist rotates the running end is automatically wound around it. care must be taken at this point not to let the running end wrap over itself. The wrap should continue until the end of the twist is reached.



6. Then another half hitch is tied about the left base of the loop. It is now safe to let go of the wrap; it can no longer get away from you.



8. With the clinch knot pulled tight and clipped, the Bimini Twist is completed.

Myself and several of our club members have received an anonymous flyer, regarding an Amended Proposal by the U.S. Department of the Interior / Organ Pipe National Monument, and numerous questions have been raised regarding said Amended Proposal.

After reviewing the Amended Proposal, the following items *appear to be the proposed changes:

- 1. An entrance gate to Organ Pipe National Monument
- 2. A reduction in speed to 45 mph, only at the gate site

* I use the word "appear", as the Amended Proposal includes numerous reports and is several hundred pages in length. It is not always easy to extract the pertinent information, and what is pertinent to me may not be pertinent to you.

The Amended Proposal affects the entire membership and your response to these issues, is important. Please take a minute to write your response on the reverse side of this notice, and mail or fax a copy to the parties below, or to the undersigned.



Improved Clinch Knot

This is a basic knot everyone should learn for tying lines or leaders to hooks or lures with straight eyes, and for tying on swivels, snap swivels, etc. This knot is dependable, easy and retains nearly 100% of line strength.



Stick the end of the monofilament line through the eve and make at least five twists around the line. Then push the end through the first loop (nearest the eye) and then back through the big loop, as shown in Fig. 1. Holding the lure or swivel and the line, pull the knot tight so it looks like the knot in Fig. 2. Cut off the end closely. Five turns around the line are essential for proper strength. If more than six turns are made, the knot can't be pulled tight enough. The knot must be pulled tight so the monofilament won't slip and cut itself. When using heavy monofilament, wind a rag around your hand to protect it while pulling the knot tight. Three or four turns are enough for extremely heavy monofilament, such as 60lb. test and stronger.

Cholla High Profile Boat Owners

The power lines are being installed in Cholla Bay. Last weekend the *Adrienne* was being taken back to the skipper's house and the launcher driver veered off through the desert. The skipper and crew looked up and realized he was avoiding the newly strung power lines that the mast would have hit had he continued on his normal route. Tom Banks and Bill Yonker have moved their boats to a place closer to the water so they don't get blocked out. Unfortunately, there are few if any safe places because the drop lines from the power poles to each individual property will come in at 20 feet off the ground. Since there will be some sag, the lines will probably be as low at 18 or 19 feet over the edge of the roads,

Obviously this will impact many high profile power boats as well as sail boats. A real safety hazard is being created because of the power lines. Pete Peterson, president of the Cholla Homeowners Association advised that special transformers are required for underground drop lines and the contractor has only ordered transformers for aerial drops. Basically nothing has been done at this point to preserve the boating lifestyle in Cholla.

Here are some suggestions for resolving this problem. We are open to any other ideas, so please let us know.

- 1. Bury some of the main power lines to create a corridor from storage areas to the water. This would also require the burial of the drop lines going to the residences.
- 2. Create a storage area where there would be no lines at all between it and the water.
- 3. Create corridors to as many current residents with high profile boats as possible.

A storage yard would need electrical power for tools and battery charging, water for cleaning, and good security. We hope the developer would provide the land and facilities at no charge to existing resident-owners of high profile boats since most of us purchased a bank trust because of the ease of access for our boats.

PROTECT YOUR EYES FROM THE SUN

Most sunglasses block ultraviolet rays but some, particularly of the plastic variety, fail to block infrared rays. Both can damage eyesight. Green or gray lenses of high-quality optic glass provide protection from both. The best color value evidently is transmitted by natural gray lenses, which view all colors evenly with true value.

Leading manufacture's suggest a test for sunglasses efficiency. Put on the pair being considered and look in the mirror. If you can see your eyes easily, the lenses are not dark enough for adequate protection from sun glare. Yellow lenses are for hazy days only because they do the opposite of what

sunglasses are intended to do: they magnify light intensity instead of diminishing it.


Polarized lenses eliminate excessive glare by means of a polarized layer of material sandwiched between two pieces of glass which then are pressed into proper curvature. They can be made to prescription. The polarized layer helps when looking downward but not when looking ahead, such as at a 90° angle. Then, we have to depend on the outside layers of colored glass (or plastic) to do the job. Plastic lenses serve their purpose only to a degree because they are soft and very easily scratched, so high-quality ones of optical glass are well worth the added cost.

The modern range in protective glasses is too complex to more than touch on here. Suffice it to say that sunglasses can be obtained with photochromatic polarized lenses (which change from light to dark depending on the intensity of the sun's rays) and that many types can be had as bifocals.

One also should consider, particularly in tropic climates, the fact that light can leak in around the edges of sunglasses. For this reason glasses that enclose the entire eye area, such as skiers and mountain climbers use, provide added protection. Such "goggles" may be considered unattractive for fishing, but they are excellent protection from flying hooks.

Finally, to prevent dropping glasses overboard, cords, elastic and other-wise, are available that go around the neck and fasten to the frames. They allow you to pull off your glasses and let them hang

against your chest.

Fish Math

If you lack a scale, the weight of your fish can be determined quite accurately with a tape measure. There are small metal ones that wind up, but they can get messy with fish slime. Almost weightless and cheaper are the yard-long cloth ones pilfered from the family sewing basket, and these can be washed.

To determine the weight of a fish, just measure its length (L) and girth (G). the

formula is:

$G^2 \times L \div 800 = W$ (Weight)

For example, if the fish is 18 inches long and 10 inches in girth, square the girth (100). Multiplying by 18 inches (Length) gives 1800, divide by 800 equals 2.25 pounds.

This formula works accurately for fish up to about 15 pounds, but it deviates somewhat

when they are larger.




