

LEATHERFISH CORRECTION:

Last month in the chatter we printed a picture of a leather bass and said it was a leatherfish. Well, we have been corrected and thought we would pass on the correct information to the readers.

The correct information came from Mike Baltzly and the book Reef Fishes of the Sea of



Leatherfish (Epinephelus acanthistius) are a medium sized grouper. Their official common name in English is "gulf coney", and the common name in Spanish is usually given as

"baqueta".

Leatherfish are most closely related to pinto, and slightly more distantly related to grouper and sardinero. You can see this relationship by comparing the large head, chunky body and rounded fins that pinto and leatherfish share with the more streamline shape and square fins of the grouper and sardinero. Depending on age and water depth, the color varies in intensity.

The Gulf coney ranges from Peru, north throughout the Gulf of California and as far north as Puerto Peñasco. This moderately deep-water sea bass is found over patch reefs and sandy bottoms, usually at depths exceeding 150 ft. It is sometimes sold as "red snapper" in Puerto Peñasco fish markets.



lots of fun and good food too!




PHOENIX MAY MEETING





WHAT ABOUT FISHIN

Well, I am happy to report that the Pinto are showing up in more abundance this year. We were out at ten mile reef, on a little hill top, and got into some really big trigger (4-5 lbs.). Then we started catching pinto along with the trigger and a few good size rock bass. We were using squid and cut rock bass at that time. The cut rock bass seemed to work better, because the larger chunks seemed to allow the pinto to actually get some before the trigger ate it all up. Trigger swarm the bait and are known to steal your bait even before it gets to the bottom. In my experience, this is exactly where you want to be. The pinto seem to reside under dense swarms of triggers.

Try this! I use a Penn 49L (my favorite semilight rig), rigged with 80 lb. line and a treble hook for this type of fishing. The reel is a fast retrieve and the 80 lb. won't let any size pinto escape. As I mentioned earlier, try cut rock bass for bait. Just make sure the chunks are fairly large so the small bites won't steal your bait. When the pinto bites, he won't nibble, he'll just take it. So hit him hard and get a good hook set. Remember: Do not allow any slack in your line or you are going to end up with an empty hook.

The sea trout are also biting right now. The bite is either very early morning (5 am) or late evening just after sunset. I caught four sea trout in about fifteen minutes one evening. I have also talked with a guy that caught 15 sea trout off Pelican Point. He said he used a Rapala minnow, black on top with silver sides and red bottom.

So Good Luck in the Derby and hope you catch Moby!!





CHOLLA FISH CHOWDER

2 lbs. fish

(Grouper or Pinto are best but almost any fish will do)

2 large cans of whole tomatoes (chopped)

1 large white onion-chopped

1 large bell pepper-chopped

2 stalks of celery-chopped

4 medium potatoes-cubed

2 qts. of fish stock (made from boiling the bones in water)

2 Tbs. Tabasco

4 bay leaves

2 Tbs. white wine

1/4 cup lemon juice

1 Tbs. parsley

olive oil

1 Tbs. Worcestershire sauce

In a large pot sauté onions, pepper and celery in olive oil until tender. Add fish stock, tomatoes, potatoes, Worcestershire sauce, Tabasco and bay leaves, and bring to boil. Boil until potatoes are tender but not mushy. Add fish, return to a slow simmer, and stir until the fish is flaky and evenly distributed throughout the chowder. Add the white wine, cover, and slowly simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in the lemon juice and parsley 5 minutes before serving.

TECH TALK

Antenna Wire

Coax cable is what is used in almost all radio to antenna connections. Coax cable is designed to transfer your radio transmitter's energy to your antenna with as little loss as possible. It is precisely made, with the correct impedance for VHF installations.

There are three basic sizes of coax cable for VHF radio installations: RG-58, RG-8X and RG-8U. As a rule of thumb, use the largest coax you can fit to reduce signal loss. Here is the reason. Almost all VHF radios start with about 25 watts of transmit power. As soon as the signal starts down the coax cable, it begins to loose some strength. This loss is measured in dB. High gain antennas cannot recover this loss energy, but they can focus the remaining energy across the water so you come through with as much punch as possible.

Bigger coax reduces signal loss between the radio and the antenna, which increases the power at the antenna. The chart below shows the effect of using different sizes of coax.

One of the best ways to reduce your radio's performance is by putting a poor splice in your antenna cable. Splices made without the correct connectors can reduce your transmit power by a factor of ten or more. When it is necessary to splice a coax cable, be sure to use PL-259 connectors and a PL-258 double male connector. This will reduce losses compared to simply soldering or crimping the connectors.

One drawback of connectors is that they can allow water to get into the cable. Water tends to "wick" inside the braided shield on the cable, which quickly corrodes the copper into a green crust. A good way to help prevent this is to apply heat shrink tubing after the connection has been coated with silicon grease.

FISHING LICENSES & BOAT PERMITS


According to the Mexican Fisheries Office in San Diego, the annual sportsmen's fishing license in Mexico has been bumped up from \$27.40 to \$31.25 for this year.

Annual permits for private boats fishing in Mexican waters have also increased from \$22.50 to \$23.80 for boats under 23 feet, and from \$45 to \$47.60 for boats 23 feet to 29' 11".

Licenses and boat permits can at times be hard to find in Mexico. If you have trouble locating these permits in you can contact the Mexican Fisheries Office in San Diego at (619) 233-4324. If you need a license or permit in a hurry you can contact Mike Kannapel at Anglers & Hunters Travel in Mesa, (602) 962-1976, he usually has them on hand. As with any service you can usually expect to pay a handling fee.




