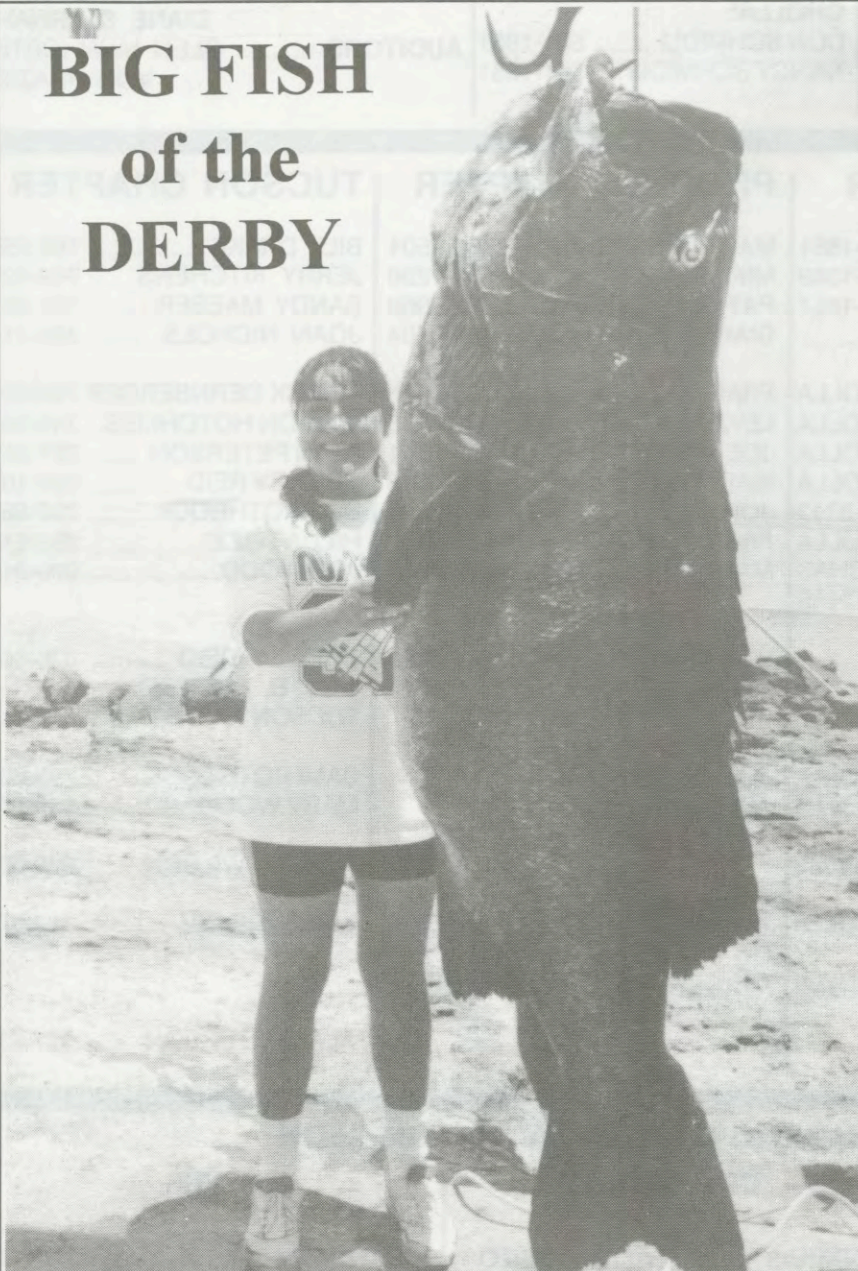

It's that time of year again for all you happy campers. The campout will be at the same site as last year, the ELKS PICNIC GROUNDS North of Pine, AZ.

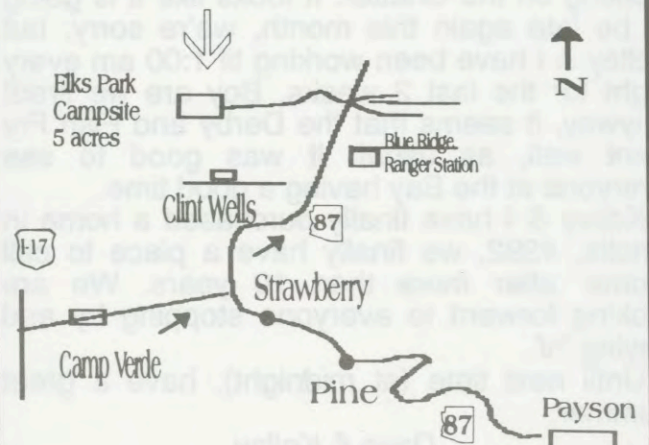

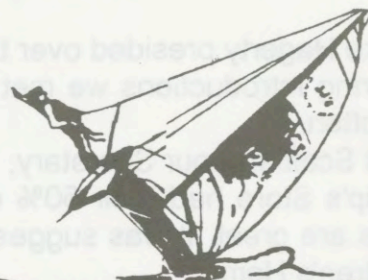

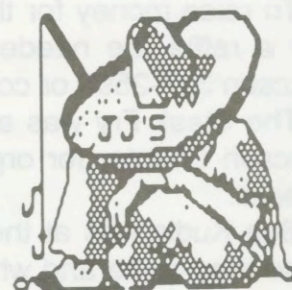

## HOT FISHING ON THE COOL PACIFIC

So you want to go fishing some place cool and comfortable. You're thinking about the White Mountains or up on the Rim? Maybe Colorado, Montana, Canada or Alaska? All good choices, except for offshore in Canada or Alaska all you're going to catch is some dink trout or bass, nothing like you're used to catching down at the Bay. A trip to Alaska or Canada can be expensive and time consuming.

I, like most of you like to fish salt water. I am limited in time that I can be away from my work and am on a pretty tight budget. I have found the answer to all of these criteria. It is a place that is only a 6 1/2 hour drive or even better yet less than an hour by air. That place is San Diego. The best part is that most of the summer, the cool Pacific breezes keep the area cool and it's even cooler out on the water. On an overcast day in July or August a warm jacket may be necessary to keep comfortable, especially at night.

With some good planing a person can fly to San Diego, fish 1 1/2 - 2 days on a limited load boat and return home with a cooler full of fillets for under \$250. That's a cool break - at a budget price.

If you want to drive and take the family, trips from 1/2 day to as long as you want to go are available. Prices start at @ \$25 and go up from there depending on what you want to do and how long. The key to a successful trip is good planning. That is the right time, the right boat and the right travel agent to give you the straight poop.

As of this writing, the word from San Diego is "large schools of Blue Fin Tuna have shown about 95 miles out and Yellow Fin Tuna have been caught 75 miles from the docks". Reports also indicate Albacore Tuna may also be in close soon for the first time in 5 years.

If you want to try San Diego give me a call (Steve at 968-3868 ) and I'll try to steer you in the right direction.

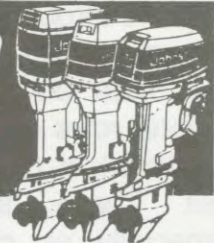

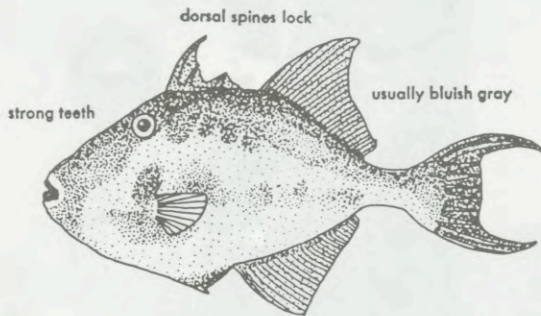

## Finescale Trigger fish ( COTCHI )

Found throughout the Sea of Cortez, both inshore and offshore. Body color ranges from brownish to a blueish gray. They are voracious feeders and will take almost any bait and most jigs. Cotchi are very strong fighters and an excellent eating fish. Average weight is 2 - 4 lbs. but, can weigh more than 8 lbs. and grow to 2 1/2 ft. in length.

## Sierra Mackerel ( PEZ SIERRA )

Found throughout the Sea of Cortez, inshore in large schools. The Sierra body colors are dark blue on the back, a silver body and several rows of golden spots along the sides. An excellent game fish that hits jigs and live bait. These fish are very good eating especially as civiche. They are also used extensively for bait. The average weight is 1 - 5 lbs. can reach 15 lbs., and 3 ft. long.

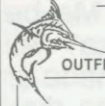

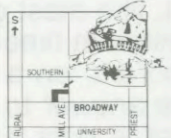

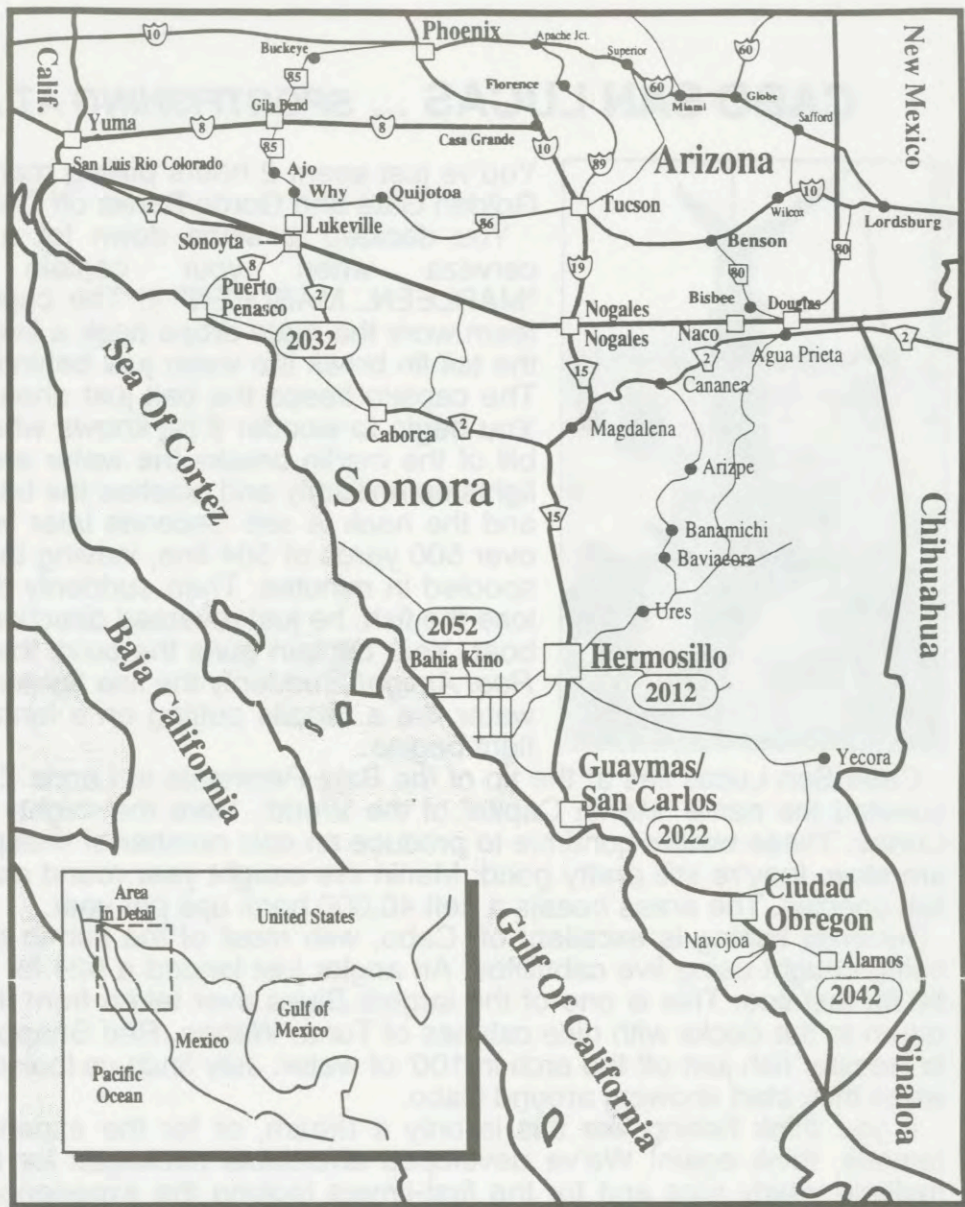

## THE WHENCE AND WITHER OF WHY

Relatively few people know the where, when, what and why of Why, a tiny community south of Ajo at the junction of Arizona highways 85 and 86.

But Peggy Kater, sometimes called the "Mayor" of Why, knows the answers.

Mrs. Kater came to Why in 1949 with her late husband, James C. Kater. That was after she got the Bureau of Land Management to open up a few tracts of land around Why.

A former trader, trapper and gold miner on the nearby Papago Indian Reservation, Mrs. Kater was a mover in developing the area and naming the town, which had a population of 130 (in 1979).

The place used to be called Rocky Point Junction (because it was the turning point enroute to Rocky Point, Mexico), but when folks here got ready for a post office, the postal department said there were too many junctions.

"So we had a meeting. Because so many people asked 'why' anyone would come out here, we all decided that Why would be a good name," she explained.
