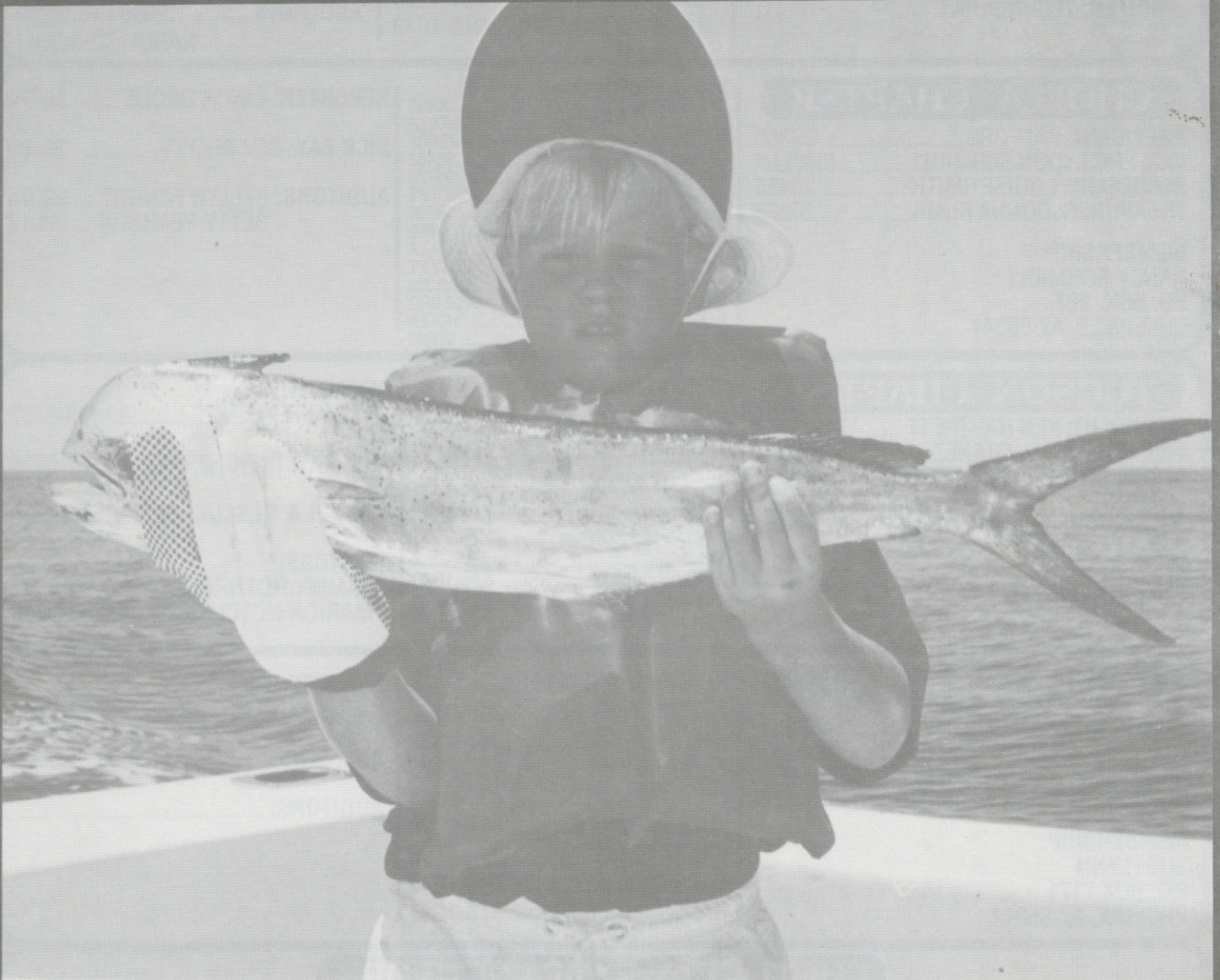

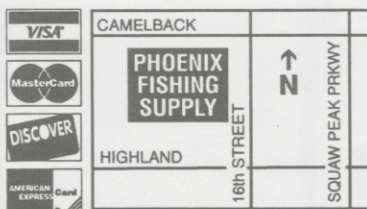

Women's Fashion and Fishing:

As a person with SOME sense of fashion and a passion for fishing, we decided to help others that may be struggling in this area. Some things work better than others and it's always done with flair! Many times the wind is blowing and a hat is more than an accessory, it becomes a necessity. The combat helmet doesn't work with anything you could possibly put on so we suggest a large weave type hat that acts not only as a shield for the sun but covers up hair that didn't quite have a fresh bouncy feeling before you left the cabin this morning. This is a good wind shield for large gusts and you're really tired of yanking that not so fresh hair out of your face and impeding your view of the most important duty for the day, outfishing your companions.

Sunglasses go without explanation. Rhinestones are not in this year and you may entice fish to your face, this would not be a good thing. Especially trigger fish!

Depending on the current temperature, long or short bottom covers work really well when boarding and disembarking from the boat. Without them, way too many comments are made and lots of finger pointing occurs. Brightly colored trousers are strictly based on personal preference. The fish really don't care and the type of fabric can be of varying types and bulk. Paper or plastic not recommended.

To cover the upper torso is extremely important if body parts have not been out to enjoy the sun in a while. Highly recommended if your upper body has never seen the sun! Scoop necks are good for the upper temperatures, too much of a scoop neck may incite warm temperatures on your boat or on the shore. Use caution when making a selection or you may not be going fishing at all. An easy access torso cover may distract companions on the boat and this may give you a slight advantage but always leave something to mystery and don't give out too much too soon, at least wait until your companions have had at least 2 beers and then pace yourself.

Footwear should be considered carefully. Not necessary when entering the water but really recommended when dancing on a hot surface. Actually, not having footwear is the leading cause of dancing on a hot surface. Again this is up to personal preference and plastic looks goofy. I won't be there to look so go for it. As a matter of fact, once you leave the dock, you can remove whatever has been recommended above if you want. Use good judgement when nearing other boats though. Perhaps a blast from the horn would be nice, if you are a lumpy pale person and wanting to show it off to us, warn us first. If you are not any of those things and perhaps ride on the skinny side, let me introduce you to my hook....we're outta bait!

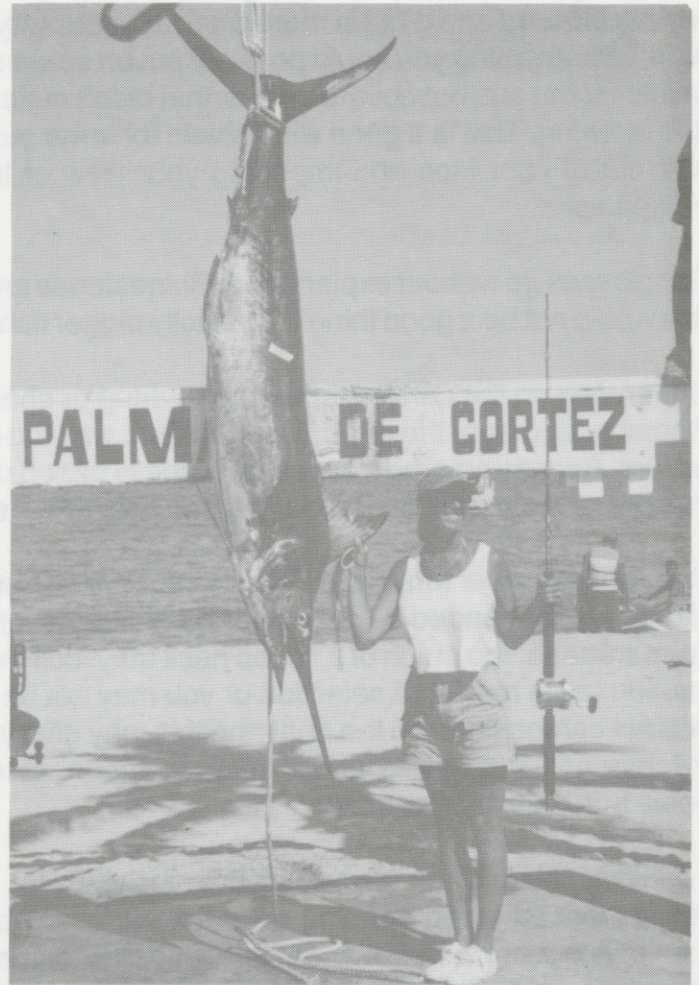
Palmas De Cortez, Baja
