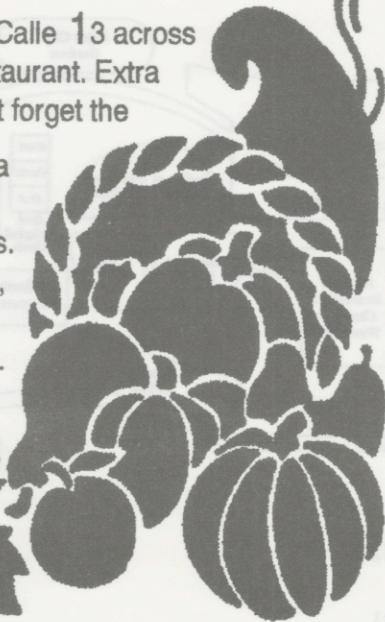

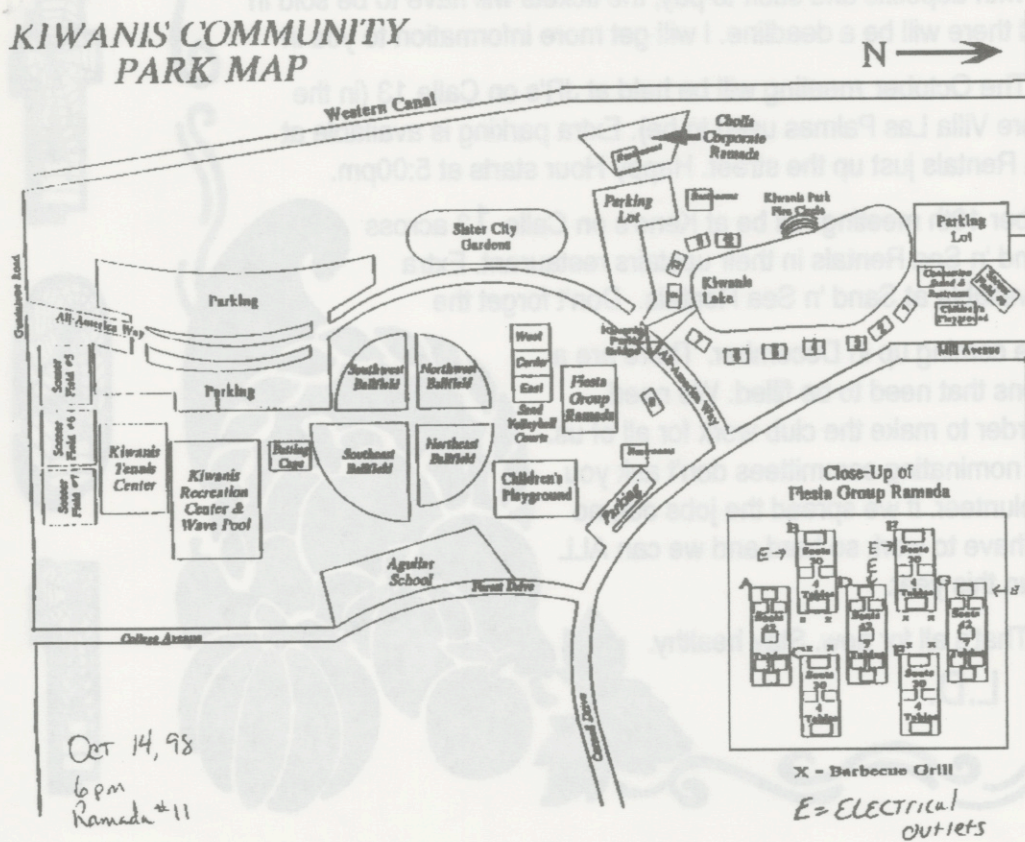

Letter to the Editor

RE: Cholla Bay VHF Radio System

In the June issue of the Chatter, Paul Schoonover wrote an article in which he stated that VHF channel 26 repeater system was installed at no cost to CBSC. I feel that it is necessary to correct this misstatement. In January of 1978, I (with much help from Chris Tatum) assumed the job of maintaining the radio systems for CBSC. At the time, the main communications were by CB channel 3, with a few boats still using the old "long wave" 2182-2555 system. Cholla radio had VHF equipment, however due to location, it had a very limited range.

Also, existing but working, was a repeater located on top of the mountain in Rocky Point, set up to operate on VHF channel 20. This system had received electrical power from the city of Penasco - TV station next to where it was located. It had been installed and was to have been maintained by Nelson Communications Co of Phoenix, however was not maintained and the city had cut off the power.

Nelson gave this system to CBSC and the city agreed to again provide power. Chris and I got this (Channel 20) back in operation in March of '78, however the city requested that we start paying for electricity.

Regarding the system that the "Ham Radio Operators" provided. This was a remote station (on the mountain next to channel 20) for channel 16 (VHF emergency channel) with a connecting radio link to only CBSC radio shack. The radio equipment supplied was very old (tube type), the same as channel 20 and proved to have poor reliability and therefore require much maintenance, however it worked (as did channel 20) well enough, long enough to prove the value of such a system.

The problem with channel 20 was that at that time very few VHF radios were equipped with this channel as standard equipment. Therefore it served only a limited purpose. Because most radios were equipped with channel 26 in Jan of '81, Chris Tatum and I changed channel 20 to 26. In May of 1993, Chris and I proposed to the CBSC Council to purchase new equipment to replace both of these systems and we were given a budget of \$8,000 for this project. This equipment was received in July and installed in August of that year and I have maintained these

systems up to the present time. Total investment by the CBSC for these systems is nearly \$10,000, not "No Cost".

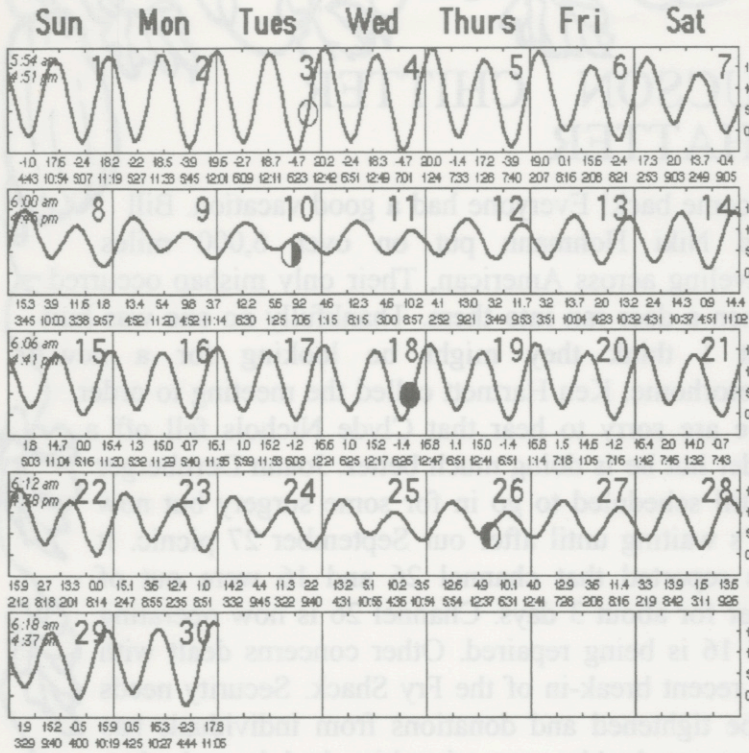

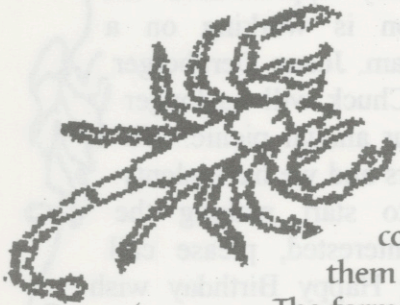

Scorpions

The Scorpion is a pesky little critter and there are plenty out there to entertain us all. We all know, this can be a problem to those of us new to La Cholla. Years ago, it was a big problem for homeowners during construction projects in the Valley too. Seems moving lumber around shakes them up a bit. Building on their nests can create huge headaches (sound familiar?).

The former CBS station (channel 10) recommended back in the 1960's to keep (straight) Ammonia around to put on a bite until you can get to medical attention. The

Ammonia apparently draws the soreness from an affected area and relieves the discomfort quite a bit. In a medical environment, Lidocaine is used to relieve pain.

Scorpions are none too kind to children under the age of 7 years old. Children can get violently ill or worse if they have an allergic reaction to the venom. Scorpions are "normally" nocturnal creatures but some of us have them around the sink area or shower and can be seen during the daylight hours. They really enjoy the moisture and darkness of the drain! Their prey of choice on the food chain is the

cockroach. Cockroaches hang out in garbage and scorpions follow wherever lunch is being served. A chemical pesticide is effective and your choice would be similar to a spray product for house and garden pests. Most of us are aware that they can be hunted by night armed with a Black Light, but the best defense is a good offense. Remove the food source and keep a cover on drains. Experts also suggest filling in small cracks on your residence to discourage crawling into the house (this expert has obviously never been to a typical cabina in La Cholla!)

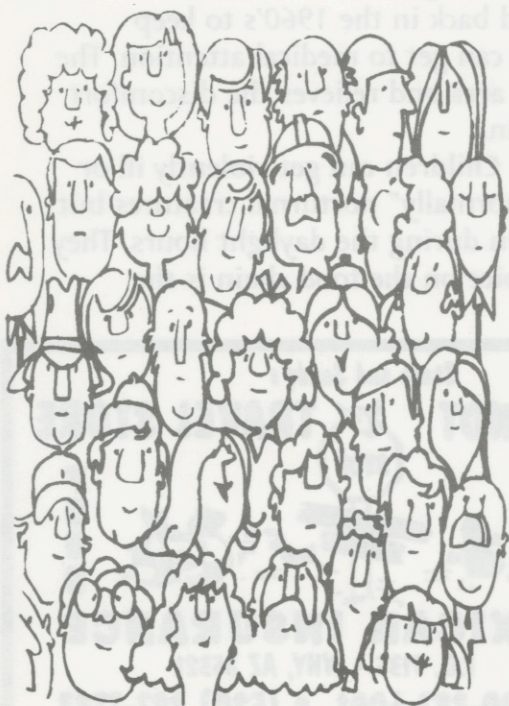

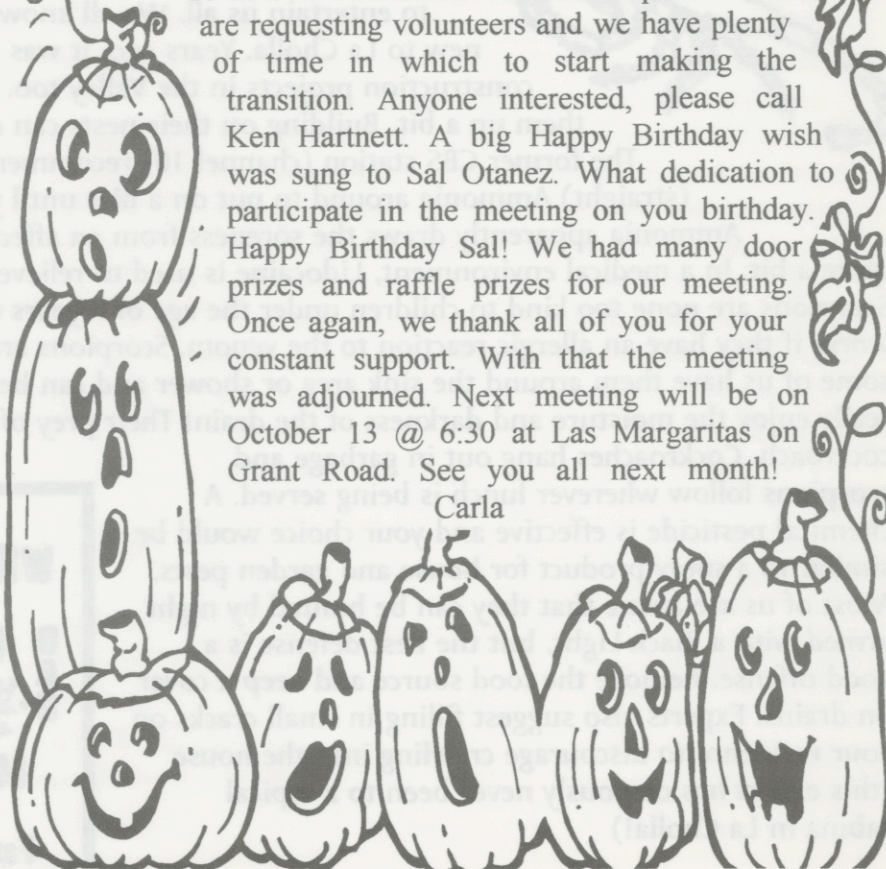


TUCSON CHITTER CHATTER
