
October opened up the tourist gates, so come on in and join in on the fun. Incidentally, fishing is good, too.

COOK'S CORNER By Adrianna Adams

ASIAN NOODLE BOWL

2 cups diced cooked chicken
1- 1" piece gingerroot, minced
2 cups thinly sliced BokChoy
2 cloves minced garlic
1/2 cup thinly sliced onions
3 cups water



2 TBS soy sauce

1/2 cup julienne sliced carrots

1 Pk. Oriental flavor Top Raman noodles (1 in. long)

Dice chicken, slice Bokchoy & green onions. Set aside. In a large cooking pot, add water, broth, package of seasoning from noodles, mushrooms, carrots, gingerroot, garlic and soy sauce. Bring all to a boil, reduce heat to medium and cook 3 to 4 minutes. Add chicken, Bokchoy, onions and raman noodles. Bring to a boil, cover and simmer 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from heat and let sit 3 minutes. Serve immediately.

Two of the people who have had the greatest impact on Cholla Bay are Alan (Pete) and Shirley Peterson. Since their arrival here in 1970, they have both been involved almost continuously with the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club, Tucson Chapter and Council, and the two Homeowners' Associations.

Pete was born in St. David, Az. And Shirely came to Tucson from Michigan. They married in 1955 and lived in Tucson. They have three daughters, now all living in Tucson.

On the Peterson's first trip to Cholla, they broke an axle on their tent trailer when they were 10 miles from Why. They didn't realize this had happened until they saw the wheel flying past them down the road! After repairs were made, they continued on to Cholla and stayed in their trailer with friends on the lot where their present house is now. They acquired the lot in 1974 and built their house on it in 1985, staying in and fixing up the cabin until then.

From the beginning, Pete helped people with their CB radio problems. He helped install the VHF radio antenna on the mountain Rocky Point 21 years ago for the Sportsmen's Club. He also showed many people how to connect their solar systems and batteries, and generators, since that was the only source of electricity at that time and most of us didn't have a clue how to install or operate these systems.

In 1976 Pete was elected treasurer of the Tucson Sportsmen's Club Chapter and was

also a Council representative and has been on the CBSC council ever since. He was the President twice and the Vice-president for many years, including now. At the time, he didn't realize it was going to be a full time, lifetime job! Pete is the Radio Chairman and he's always called when channel 26 goes out and he has to go and fix the antenna.

Shirley was Vice-president of the Tucson Chapter of the CBSC and their Membership Chairman for many years. She also was Chairman of the Christmas Party for our Mexican neighbors and worked tirelessly coordinating it and ensuring it was a

Pete served as President of the previous Homeowners Association and Shirley was the Membership Chairman. Pete was the first President of the present Vecinos Homeowners Association and held that position until this year when he decided to take a much needed rest. He is still serving on the Homeowners Board in an advisory position. Shirley was the Membership Chairman for nearly the whole time, also.
