To Tucson Beach Letter Writers:

In 14 years as a Cholla Bay homeowner I have spent hundreds of hours on Tucson Beach. Many were ruined by thoughtless people in vehicles.

It is the height of frustration to settle in for a pleasant afternoon on the beach only to have a large 4x4 screech to a halt just a few feet in front of your umbrella, destroying the view of the water. I have witnessed countless close calls involving small children and out-of-control ATC's being driven by youngsters who hadn't even reached their teens.

When I go to the beach, I want to relax, not spend my afternoon digging out some idiots who drive up the soft sand without four-wheel drive. Often, the request to help dig these people out number two or three a day. When you suggest that they can pay someone to extract their vehicle from the sand, they become confrontational.

The past spring and early summer were among the most pleasant ever at Tucson Beach because of the lack of vehicles. I know of several other families who feel the same way. And none of us have homes on the bluff above the beach.

I could live with a compromise, permitting vehicles as far as the end of the lava rocks, at least for loading and unloading. But when the tiny patch of sand on the north end of the beach looks like a parking lot at a mall, it absolutely ruins a day in paradise.

Cholla Clam Bake

Next time you have friends over for a social gathering try this simple and delicious clambake that takes no time to make and leaves you more time for relaxing and enjoying your company.

- 1½ pounds seaweed, (optional)
- 6 small potatoes, (red, white or sweet)
- 6 small onions, peeled
- 6 ears corn, shucked (husk reserved, silk discarded)
- 3 whole red bell peppers
- 2 whole heads garlic
- ½ tsp. red pepper flakes
- ½ tsp. salt, if not using seaweed
- 4 sprigs fresh rosemary or ½ tsp. dry rosemary
- 3 pounds uncooked and unpeeled shrimp
- 3 pounds live clams, scrubbed
- 4 blue crabs
- 3 cups beer (2-12oz. bottles) or dry white wine
- butter
- lemon wedges
- hot sauce

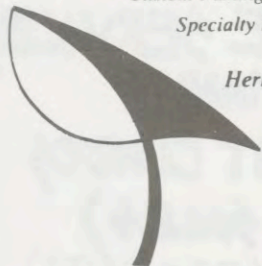
Start fire in outdoor grill about 45 minutes before you intend to begin your clambake.

Place a metal steamer rack in the bottom of a 16-quart pot at least 10 inches in diameter. If using seaweed, place ½ of it on and under the steamer rack. Add potatoes (reserving one for the top as a tester) and onions. Stand corn along edge of pot, stem end down. Add peppers and garlic. Sprinkle with red pepper flakes, salt (if using) and rosemary. Add shrimp, tied in cheesecloth. Place clams, tied loosely in cheesecloth, over the shrimp, place crabs on top along with the "tester" potato. Pour beer or wine over. Place a layer of seaweed and/or corn husk on the top and cover with lid.

Place pot on a fire grate over a white hot fire. Cook until a strong gush of steam escapes (about 35 minutes on the grill). Start timing and steam cook for about 15 minutes or until the tester potato is tender and the crab and shrimp are pink. Discard seaweed and/or corn husk. Arrange ingredients on a large serving platter. Serve with lemon butter and hot sauce.
