

CHOLLA STORM

Sunday October 22, 2000, we had a light rain off and on most of the day, however at about 3:00 or 4:00 a.m. a very hard rain came. (Total of 1 1/4"). Monday morning The Cholla roads were washed out in some areas and many houses in low areas had mud and water inside. Gus Brown got his road equipment out at day light and started repair.

At about noon on Monday, while repairing the damage from the night before, another storm moved on Cholla and in a very short time dropped another 2 1/4" of additional rain. This washed out all of the work done earlier and caused additional extensive damage. Most roads in Cholla were impassable.

Gus Brown then called all available equipment and man power to Cholla; 3 road graders, 2 or 3 back hoes and one large dozer. By Tuesday morning most main roads were passable and work continued. Several large retaining walls fell in the streets. Several houses had major damage and many were flooded.

that one. However, I think that even rain lovers probably got enough during the first storm. Oh well, that's life, I guess. We take what we get and go on. 
PHOENIX CHAPTER CHITTER CHATTER
