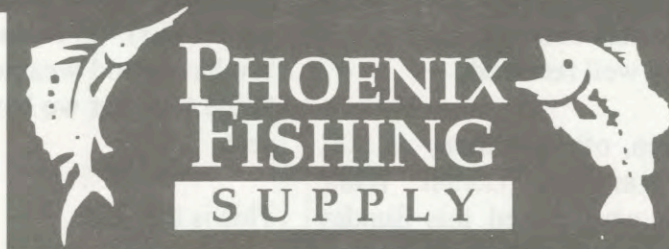

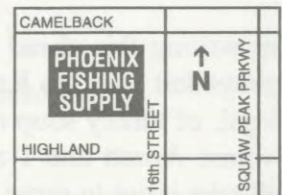

And we will continue serving them once a month through May. Maybe June also.

FRY SHACK (CLUB HOUSE)

Several years ago the CBSC built the "Fry Shack" to have a place for their annual fish fry as part of the fishing derby.

The building was used for this and some other occasional activities. When land trusts became available, the CBSC made a deal with the developer to purchase the land under the building and one lot to the north for some parking.

This purchase left the CBSC with very little resources to maintain the building. There were break ins and vandalism to the building and the roof as in need of replacement.

The Old Boys Social Club (OBSC), for several years, used the building near the playground for their activities in exchange for maintenance. With the trusts available, the developer offered to sell the building to the OBSC. The OBSC did not have funding available to make such a purchase.

The Vecinos was in need of storage and possible future office as well as the Cholla library was without an available space. Therefore, the three organizations reached an agreement to jointly work to improve the "Fry Shack" into a "Club House" for all of Cholla to use.

The OBSC invested \$10,000.00 in the first improvements (Windows, bar, doors, and part of the cost of installing the tile floor). They also provided tables, chairs, kitchen equipment, a large butane tank and one water tank. Later they paid for construction of the deck and Bar-B-Que Pit and the butane tank was installed on the roof and piped to the kitchen.

The Vecinos bought the floor tile and supplies to install the tile and paid part of the cost of the windows and doors. In addition they paid for construction of the "Office/Storage" room for its use and store rooms for CBSC and OBSC. Also a room for the library was constructed and the rest rooms rebuilt. The corridor between the kitchen and rest room was enclosed and overhead windows installed. Kitchen and serving counters were replaced with base cabinets and tile counters. All water tanks (5) were located together and new copper lines ran to rest rooms and kitchen and a pump was installed for pressure. An electric service was provided and the entire building rewired.

Land was purchased east of the building, as to allow for expansion and more parking. In a deal with the developer, the Vecinos paid a total of \$14,600.00 and individual contributions by Vecinos members made up the balance. In exchange for the Vecinos investment in this project the ownership is now a 50/50 between CBSC and Vecinos.

The OBSC is a "Great Tenant" in the project. Operation expenses such as taxes, insurance, and "normal" maintenance is shared on a "Three Way Split" Other expenses

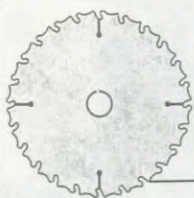

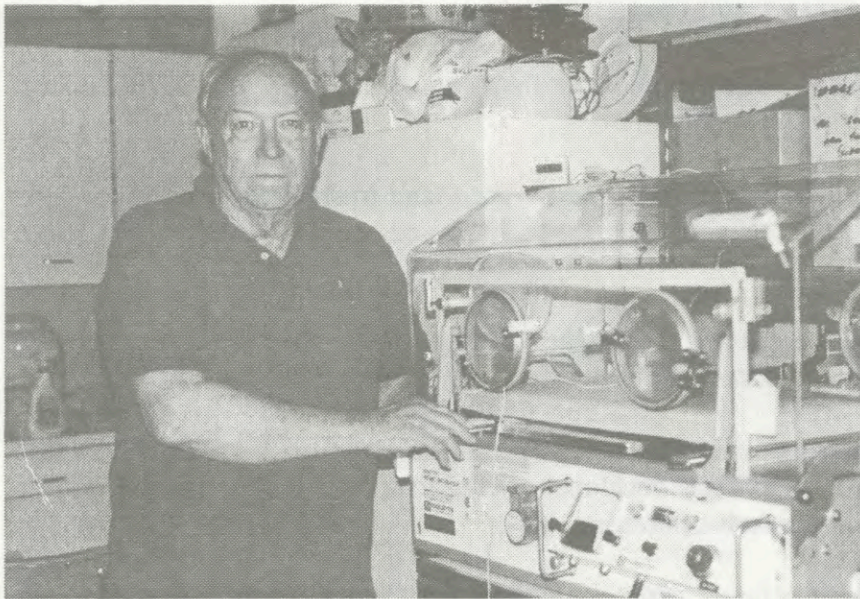

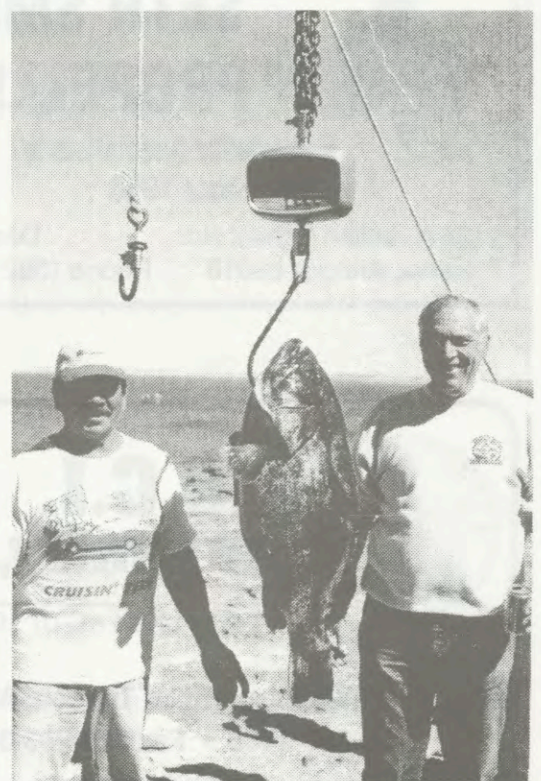

As reported in April's article numerous people have come into our offices to thank the Company for its upkeep of the Cholla road and we appreciate their compliments very much. The heavy equipment and labor costs a substantial amount of money, and the funds paid to us by the Vecinos pay only a fraction of the total expense. By now we have all witnessed and enjoyed the benefits of a good solid road to travel to and from Penasco. Now that we have the road in such good shape, we would like to go to next level, by means of a paved road to Cholla. The March, 2002 issue of the Vecinos De La Cholla newsletter informs the homeowners of the funds that are available from the Government to pave the road along a new route from the turnabout to the entrance of Cholla.

A few people have mentioned that they have contributed money for water, sewer, and electricity. While electricity has become a reality, they are still waiting for the other two. As you know, getting electricity has been a long, tedious & costly project, but it is mostly done. The Company is aware of its obligation to get the water and sewer in place and this will be done at the Company's expense. No more money will be required of you, the homeowner, for the completion of this project.

The paving of the road is a totally separate project from the water and sewer. Now is the time to take advantage of the Governments offer, which may not be available later. As stated in your Vecinos newsletter, the contributions from lot owners would be placed in a checking account, with payments made against actual work progress. Mr. Brown has suggested that the account have dual signatures--one from the Homeowners Association and one from the Company. The completion of this project will mean so much to all of us not only for the wear and tear of our cars and equipment, but especially for emergency vehicles to reach our community, giving us more security in a time of need. Also, with the paved road, the cost per lot will be more than compensated by the increase in value t your property.
