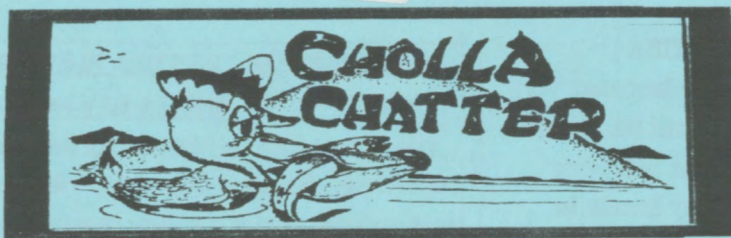

COOK'S CORNER from Adrianna

- 2-1/2 lbs chicken wings
- 1/2 cu. honey
- 1/4 c. soy sauce
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 2 scallions, diced, green and all



Place chicken wings in a bowl. Combine honey, soy sauce and garlic and pour over chicken. Toss chicken until all is coated. Marinate at least 4 hrs. then arrange chicken pieces in a shallow dish or baking pan. Bake at no higher than 350 degrees for 1 hour, until very bronzed and tender. At the last minute, scatter scallions on top. Serve hot.

HEALTH TIP FROM DONNA

During this time of year my hands become very dry and around my fingers there will be small hairline cracks like paper cuts that will burn furiously, especially when I put my hands in soapy water doing dishes, scrubbing floors etc. I have tried many types of ointments that our doctor has prescribed - this helped but it really didn't work as well as I hoped for. Our son who is a paramedic and is around hospitals a lot told us that the doctors had told him to do two things: One - stop using disinfectant hand soap as it is a drying agent and some skin types are more sensitive to it than others, and Two - Use a small dab of Super Glue on the papercuts to seal the cracks. It stops the burning immediately and allows the wound to heal. I tried it - it really works!! John and I both use it and are happy with the results. We can put our hands in soapy water and still - no burning while the wounds continue to heal.

(AND READING TOO??)**

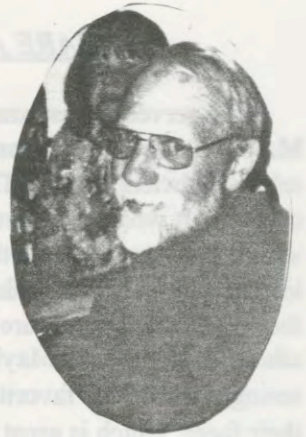


Since I didn't get the usual Dogs and Cats article, I thought you might enjoy this:

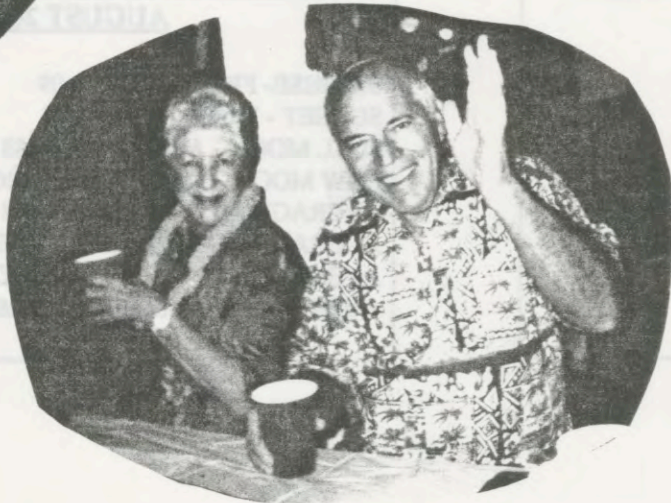
