- Another boat had gone out from Rocky Point, ran out of gas over by Black Mountain, and it got very windy and the boat Kick'N-Back went out to their rescue.
- A big Suburban tried to launch some jet skis at a really low tide and got stuck with the tide coming in. Villa had to go out and bring in the Suburban, and the jet skis.

Sometimes people think they can launch their own boats and jet skis, but sometimes have to get in pretty deep water to do so. Can't be too good on their vehicles!!

#### A TIP TO TRY

I tried this today, and it worked very well...

Help open a clogged drain by pouring 1 cup baking soda down the drain and then adding 1 cup hot vinegar. Wait a few minutes, then flush the drain with about a quart of very hot water. Repeat if necessary. This method of cleaning and deodorizing drains avoids using harsh chemicals and is kinder to the environment. Cut down to 1/4 cup baking soda and 1/2 cup vinegar for keeping garbage disposals clean.


#### **CBSC DERBY RAFFLES**


