Gene Court of Court's Custom Tackle donated a custom rod that went to the fisherperson of the Derby. Thank you.

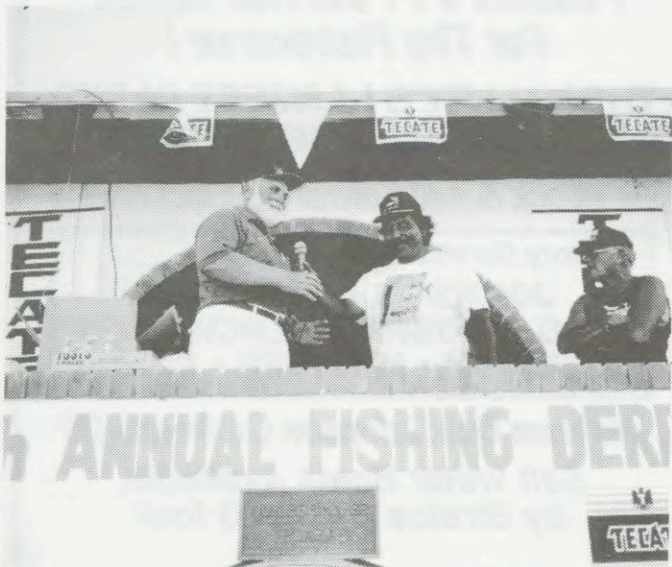

We're sure that there are people we overlooked, and were sorry, but we appreciate everything that everyone did. Thank you!



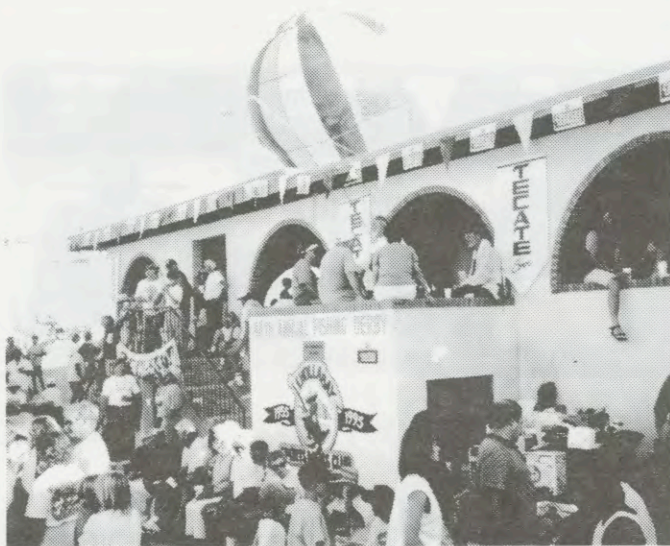

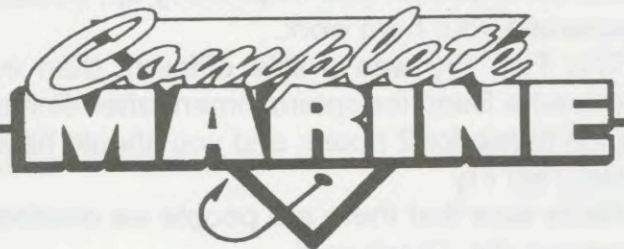

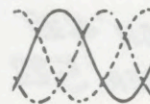

SURFACE FISHING AT CHOLLA

Warm Water Brings Game Fish to Northern Gulf
by Steve Rothbard

Each year as summer approaches I picture in my mind leaping Sailfish (Pez Vela) and arobatic Dorado dancing at the end of my line. Nothing is more exciting than the sight and feel of a beautiful game fish doing battle on light tackle across the azure blue waters of the Northern Sea of Cortez.

Most people aquatinted with Rocky Point associate it exclusively with bottom fishing. That is Grouper, Pinto, Sardinero, Pargo, Halibut, Rock bass and the ever loving Cotchi (Trigger Fish). Most of the old timers fishing out of Cholla, fish for bottom fish only. They are missing a good bet.

Summer at Cholla brings warm temperatures to the land and sea. When the water warms the Grouper head for deeper reefs where they are more comfortable. When the warm blue water from the south starts moving up to the off shore Rocky Point area, it brings bait fish and game fish. This usually happens in late May or early June. Sailfish, Dorado, Skipjack and Mackerel are among a few of the species following the blue water.

Muscling a large Grouper or Black Sea Bass from the depths brings a certain amount of satisfaction to an angler, but there is nothing like coaxing a sailfish or Dorado into taking your lure or bait and then battling him to the boat, on the surface where you can see your quarry and witness his actions.

It doesn't take a lot to convert your boat for surface fish trolling. A couple of good rod holders and flat line clips will do nicely. A pair of outriggers with clips (\$200 a pair) will add to your chances by doubling the amount of baits trolled. Your bottom tackle 4/0, 6/0, or 9/0 reel can be fitted with lighter line or used the way it is. With a few good lures and /or live bait leaders you're in business.

Troll your lures about 2 to 3 boat lengths back at about 6 knots and wait for the fun to begin. Assuming you have found blue water, look for floating kelp, rip water, water temperature changes or floating debris and troll close around the parameter but not through. Also watch for diving birds and bait fish. A good bet is to zigzag in and out of the blue water where it meets the green. Many bait fish prefer green water.

If you want to increase the fun, use your lightest tackle. These surface fish are just that. They wont head for the rocks so you can chuck that 300lb. Jenkai line, in favor of 30 or 40lb. mono or even lighter. Oh what fun!!

So remember hot weather puts bottom dwellers deep but the surface action can be fantastic. Check with your favorite tackle pro for recommendations on gear, lures and a demo on how to rig for game fish and enjoy the "Hot Action" during the summer months.

As of late June there has been Dorado, Skipjack and Yellowtail brought into Cholla, also a few Sailfish sightings. The water temperature as of late June is around 80°.



**Dolphin Fish
(Dorado)**

The body is a brilliant golden-green in color. Snout profile of older males is blunt and high foreheaded, whereas the females head is more tapered. The Dorado likes warm blue waters and migrates to the upper Gulf in late May or early June. They are an excellent food fish and can grow up to 6 ft. in length and weigh up to 90 lbs.



**Sailfish
(Pez Vela)**

The Sailfish's body is dark blue on it's back with a bright silver stomach and a very large dorsal fin. They may be seen basking on the surface following the warm waters to the upper Gulf in late May or early June. 100 lb. fish are common, but fish up to 182 lbs. have been recorded. Very poor food value, so please practice catch and release



**Black Skipjack
(Barrilete)**

Their body color is dark on top, silvery on the bottom with stripes running down the back and 3-5 black spots on the abdomen just below the pectoral fin. They migrate to the upper Gulf in late May or early June. May weigh up to 12 lbs. The meat is very strong in flavor. Skipjack makes an excellent bait fish.

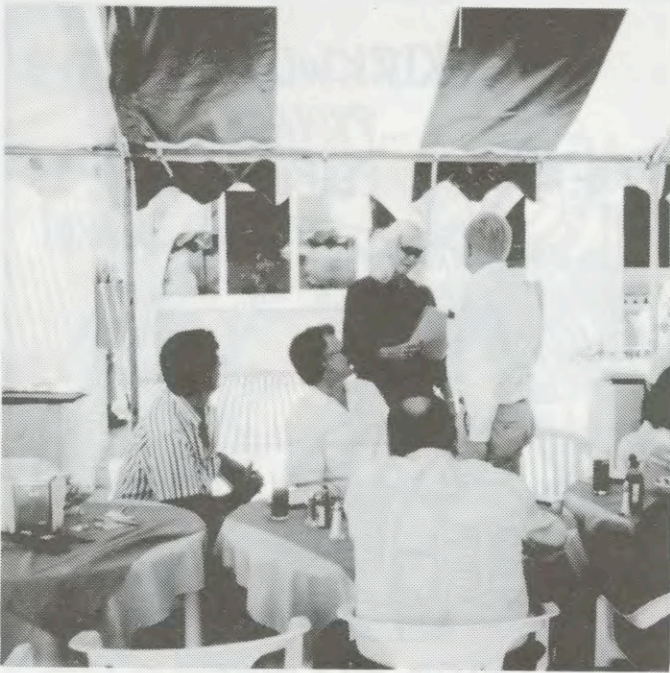

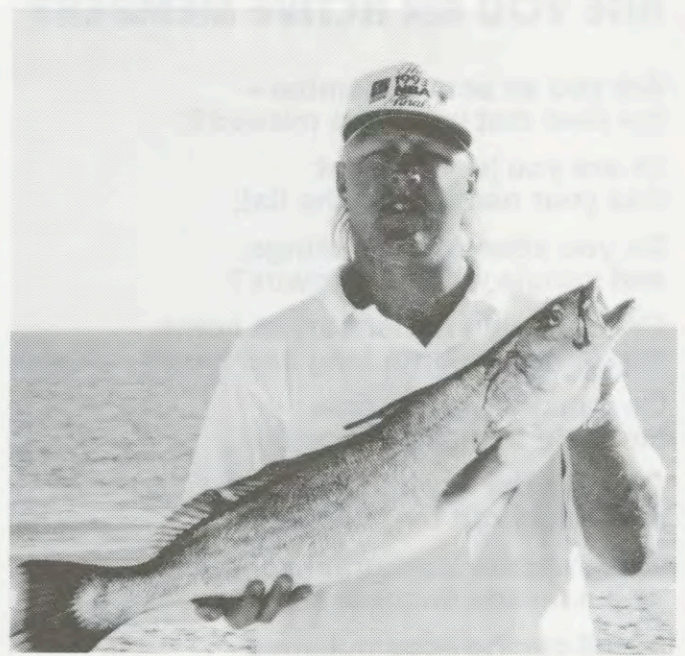

AUGUST CAMPOUT

Aug. 9th - 15th

The Phoenix Chapter will hold its annual campout for all from Aug. 9-15th. The campground is reserved for these dates, but everyone is welcome to come and go whenever. Moqui Group Camp is located in the forested highlands of Arizona's Mogollon Rim Country. Its shaded campsites provide a quiet place for a group outing in a cool stand of ponderosa pines that is easily accessible, just one mile from a paved highway. Elk, mule deer, and wild turkey are just a few of the species of wildlife you stand a good chance to see here. About 10 miles away from the camp is Blue Ridge Reservoir, a popular place to go fishing or to launch a canoe or other small boat. Passing near the campground is the Blue Ridge segment of the Arizona Trail, a state - spanning hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding trail that leads from the Mexican border to the Utah state line. Also within easy driving distance are East Clear Creek Canyon and the hiking trails that lead into it.

Additional hiking trails and scenic drives crisscross the area south of the camp leading to panoramic overlooks along the Mogollon Rim and picturesque canyons cutting through the highlands that slope away from it. Along these trails you'll find a number of old cabins, some renovated - some as nature has weathered them. These cabins once served as a home base for Forest Service fire-fighters, cowboys and sheep herders who lived and worked here before the current system of forest roads made travel relatively easy in this remote area.

LOCATION: 64 miles southeast of Flagstaff on paved and graveled roads in scenic Mogollon Rim Country. Elevation is 7,000 feet.

ACCESS: Drive 55 miles south of Flagstaff to Clints Well on FH 3 (Lake Mary Road). Turn northeast on AZ 87 about 7.5 miles to FR 138 then 1 mile to the campground. FH 3 and AZ 87 are paved. All other Forest Roads are graveled and suitable for sedans.

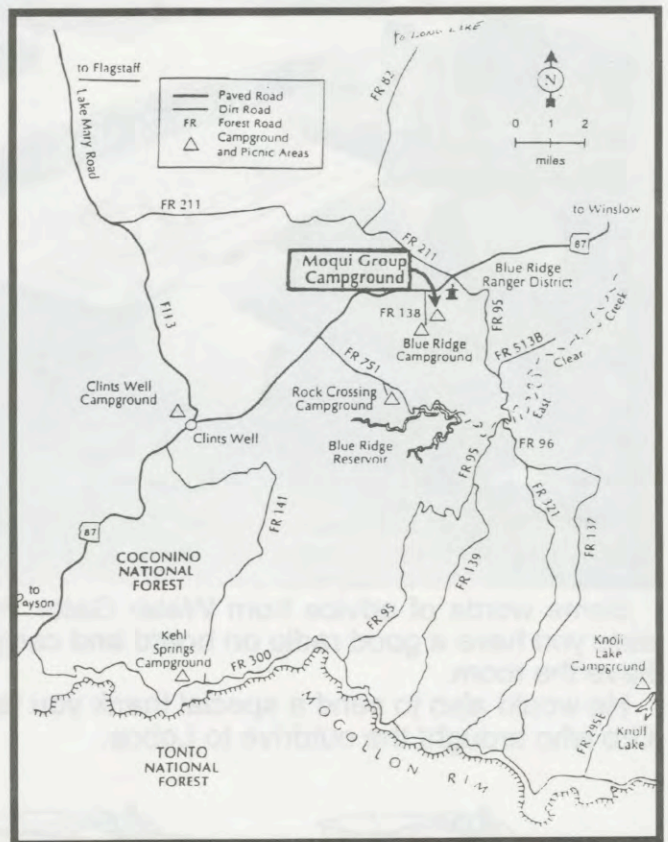

Come morning, Texas Joe went to Libertad for fuel and provisions, as one of the locals, Captain Terry offered assistance. Captain Terry told Mike that he had a trailer (a little smaller than Mike's boat) to pull the boat out of the water. They beached the boat with the help of the little trailer, what a sight. Although the boat was on shore, the outdrive was still in the sand, so they had to dig a hole in order to remove the outdrive.

Being 82 miles from Cholla Bay, radio contact was difficult. Having a good radio, they waited until sunset to radio for help. Water Gator contacted Rocky Point and asked for someone to bring an outdrive to Lobos by land. Tuesday morning several people from Playa De Oro drove to Lobos and brought the outdrive. During all of this a storm came up with high winds - Texas Joe and Handy Man beached their boats because of the storm conditions. The storm was a big one, so they opted to take shifts watching the anchors. They each held a 2 hour shift to make sure they all remained anchored. They had two days worth of bad weather, which wasn't helping the situation any. The morning of the fifth day, Water Gator was out of beer, whiskey and cigarettes, and he was ready to go home.



Once the outdrive was replaced, they were ready to head back to Rocky Point. One would think that with all of this trouble, what else could go wrong. Well, on the way back Texas Joe's boat broke down, as well as Handy Man's boat who had to be towed in. They all made it back to shore safely, but not without stories to tell. Augustin had "Chicken Boy" provide chicken for the tired group. Water Gator said that was some of the best chicken he'd ever eaten. Mike's wife Betty was happy they had returned safely and kissed him, Mike was even happier than Betty that he was home.

Some words of advice from Water Gator: You may be out longer than planned, so always make sure you have a good radio on board and carry extra batteries, gas, food, beer, and an outdrive if you have the room.

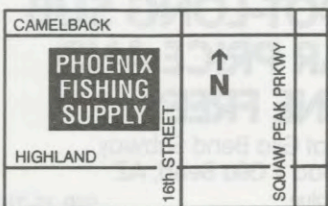



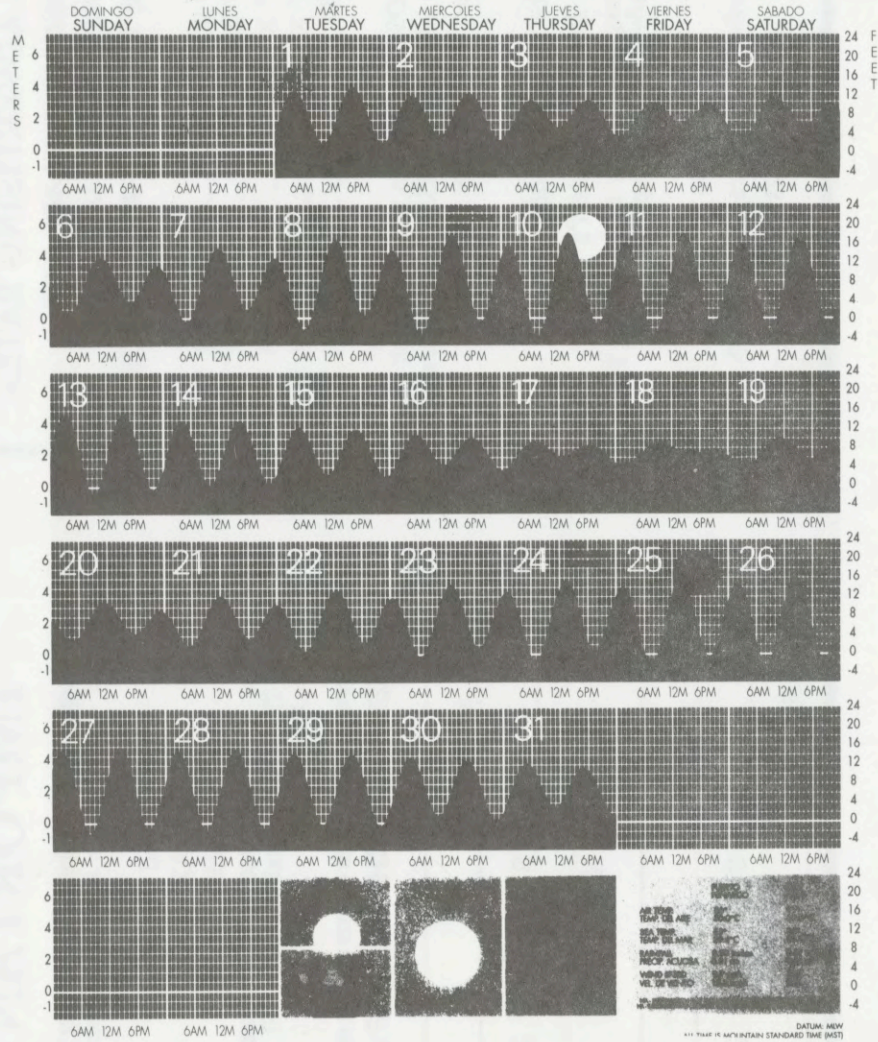
