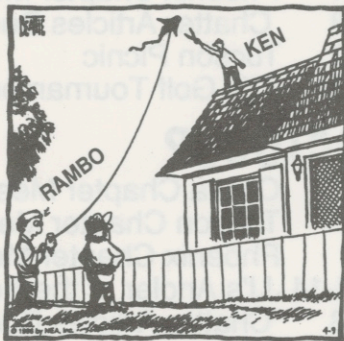

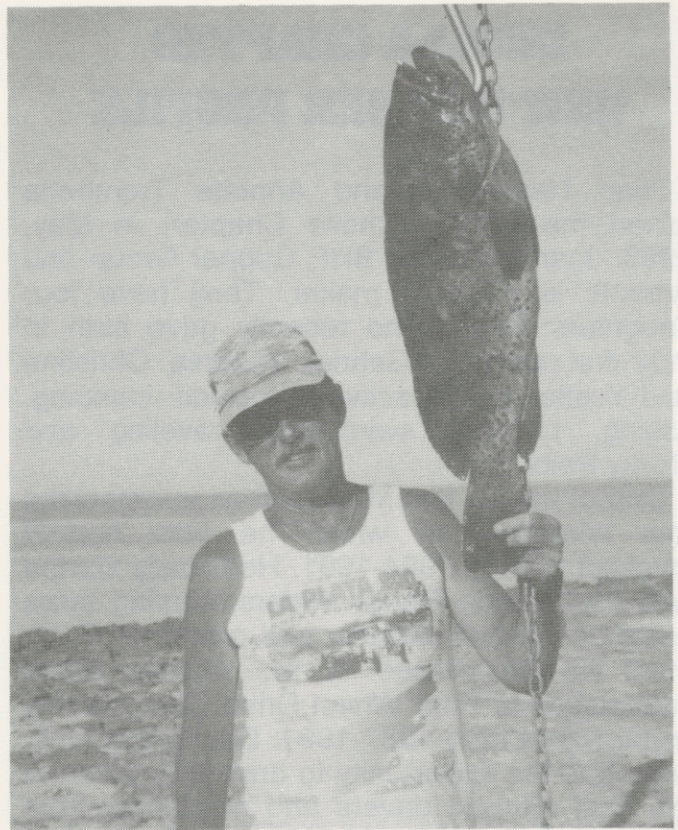

VIEWS OF A "NEWBEE"

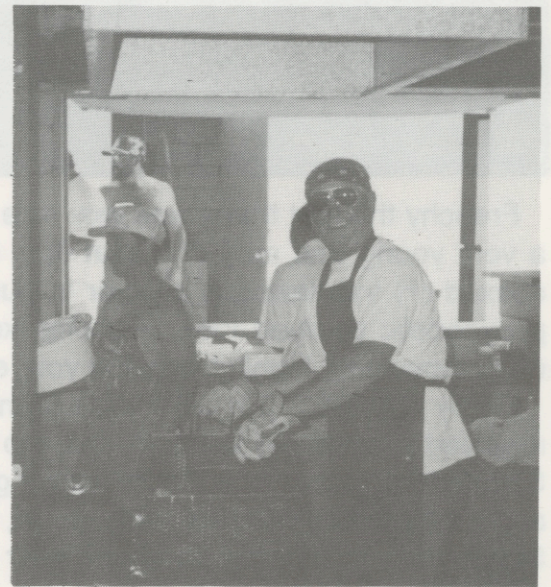

Being a relative newcomer to Cholla Bay and an even newer member of the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club, I was asked to give my observations of the 41st Annual CBSC Fishing Derby and Fish Fry. Actually, I wasn't asked: I was volunteered by my wife, Sunshine Josie. But that's OK: when I found out about it: I got quite excited about the prospect of sharing my feelings with our new friends and neighbors. Although I have been indirectly involved with the CBSC Fishing Derby itself because my wife, Sunshine Josie, has been doing a lot of the photography for the Chatter, this was our first Fish Fry. The fishing derby was conducted over 4 weekends beginning in March and culminating with the gala Fish Fry and Awards dinner on June 8th.

I was surprised to learn that this all volunteer organization had been around since 1956 when I was just a tadpole. The reason of the group's existence is a noble one indeed: to establish a radio safety network to aide in the efforts of search and rescue and to help fellow boaters feel more safe out on the water.

The operative word for the day was "FREE!!!". Over 900 people braved near triple digit temperatures to attend this year's event which was held at the CBSC Fry Shack in Cholla Bay, but their hardiness paled by comparison to those 25 courageous souls who endured 140+ degree heat to cook up almost 500 pounds of fish and prepare all those meals. In talking to Shirley Peterson (Chairperson of the kitchen) about their group, I discovered that many of those who signed up to help were "No Shows". Being the great bunch of folks that they are, others quickly volunteered (for FREE!!!) to step in, roll up their sleeves (for those who could stand to wear sleeves) and get messy and very sweaty. As if that wasn't bad enough, the generator quit so they couldn't even run the exhaust fans to pull some of the hot out. But with a lot of fluids, smiles, and ice water neckties they persevered.

The Fish Fry itself was a kid's best dream. It had a carnival-like atmosphere with brightly colored balloons and decorations, everyone laughing and having a great time joking with old friends and it was all FREE!!!! It was open to everyone who came. Gringos and Mexicans stood shoulder-to-shoulder eating, drinking and laughing together. All of the fish was donated (for FREE!!!) by entrants of the Fishing Derby. More than half of the fish came from Gus and Irma Brown alone: a special thanks for your generosity.

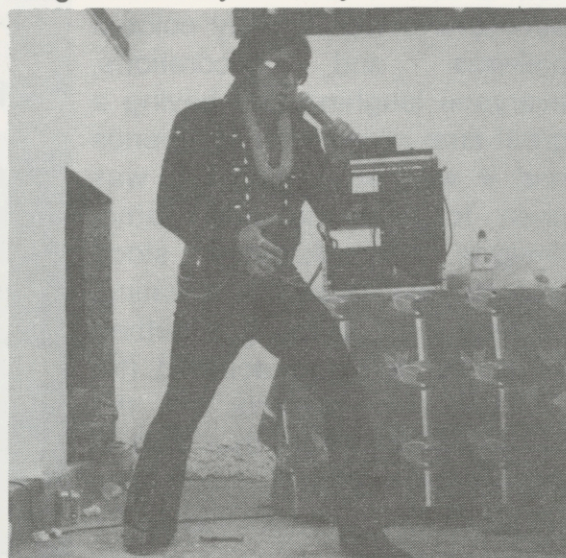

This was his way of giving back to the community. All I know is that It would have been a mighty parched crowd without them. Muchas Gracias!!! We couldn't have done it without your support.

DOES SIZE MAKE A DIFFERENCE

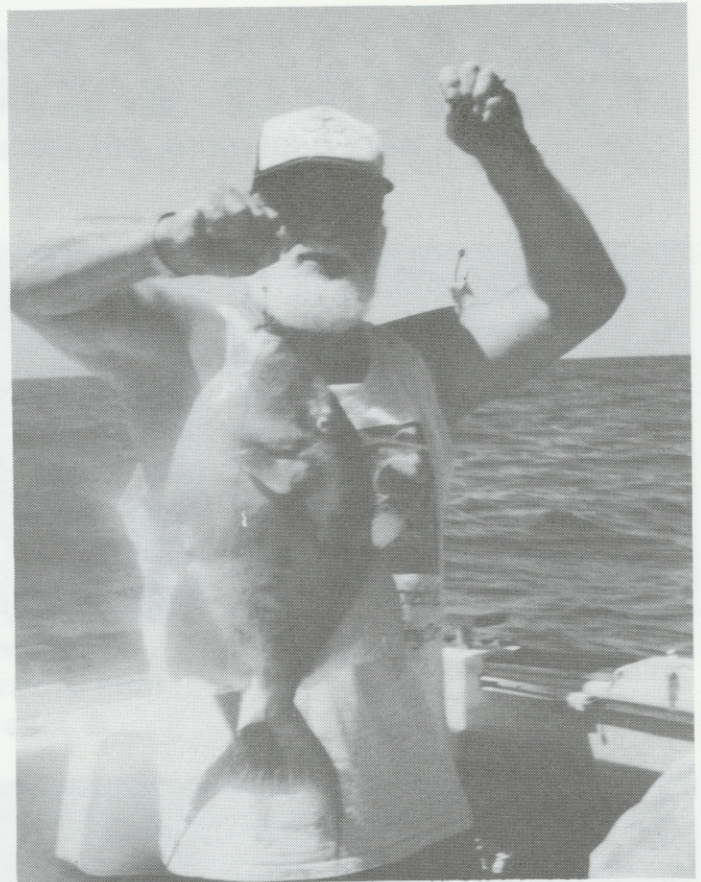
Small motorboats - 18 to 23 - footers are targets of choice for thieves, says the Boat Owners Association of the United States, which puts more than half of all stolen boats in that class.

The association says an average of 1,000 boats a month are snatched and offers anti-theft suggestions, including strong locks, alarm systems and removing a wheel from the trailer.
