





# What About Fishin

One of the things I like best about Cholla Bay is the sportsmen. By that I'm referring to fact that if you're on the water and have a problem, you'll get help pretty darn quick. Augustin monitors the radio and is always there when you need him. Usually the closest boat will come to your aid. They'll either tow you in or help you fix what is wrong. If you need to borrow something, they'll lend it to you, not expecting anything but borrowed object returned. That is what I call a sportsman.

Unfortunately, there is a distasteful, new practice that has just gotten started in Cholla and that is the selling if GPS coordinates. I'm not talking about buying Wally's book either. I'm talking about paying big bucks for a GPS setting. Come on folks, do we really have to stoop to these kind of antics? There are a great many reefs off Cholla to fish and they hold a multitude of fish. Enough fish to last all of us and hopefully our kids a lifetime. Instead of selling GPS settings, why don't we invite people onto our boats or maybe buddy boat with someone new to the Cholla area. Al Scott founded the CBSC to promote fellowship and safety.

For those of you that don't know the headings and distance for most of the available reefs, Dave and Kelley Adams have graciously allowed me a bit of extra space this month so I can print the following map and coordinates. Make a copy of it or cut it out of the chatter to keep in your boat. Then when you need to, you can refer to it for a fishing spot. Remember this, take time once you've hit the reef to use your depth finder to study the bottom and find the fish. Without the proper preparation, even the most expensive GPS setting won't get you fish.

I hope this map helps you out and gives you a better understanding of where the reefs are in relationship to Cholla. Good luck and go catch Moby!






# THE STEAK FRY






