

# \$15 Border Fee?

As most of you already know, Mexico is imposing a \$15 per person visitor fee which is supposed to go into effect July 1st. The fee would be collected from airline passengers and those traveling by car or bus more than 15 miles into Mexico.

Arizona Gov. Jane Hull and Sonoran Gov. Armando Lopez Nogales have spoken out against this fee. Both governors said it could disrupt tourism and hurt efforts to open the Arizona-Sonora region up to foreign tourist with the two-nation vacation concept. The efforts of these two governors have led the Mexican government to exempt those headed to Puerto Penasco from the fee.


Friday, June 11th, was the last day that you could fish in the derby and despite a little wind, there were many boats that launched in Cholla Bay.

# Tired Of Waiting Around Each Month For The Chatter To Arrive?

#### Time to Surface Troll out of Cholla

Summer at Cholla brings warm temperatures to the land and sea. When the water warms the Grouper head for deeper reefs where they are more comfortable. When the warm blue water from the south starts moving up to the off-shore Rocky Point area, it brings bait fish and game fish. This usually happens in late May or early June but, it looks like it might be a little later this year. Sailfish, Dorado, Skipjack and Mackerel are among a few of the species following the blue water.


It doesn't take a lot to convert your boat for surface fish trolling. A couple of good rod holders and flat line clips will do nicely. A pair of outriggers with clips will add to your chances by doubling the amount of baits trolled. Your bottom tackle 4/0, 6/0, or 9/0 reel can be fitted with lighter line or used

the way it is. With a few good lures and/or live bait leaders you're in business.

Troll your lures about 2 to 3 boat lengths back at about 6 knots and wait for the fun to begin. Assuming you have found blue water, look for floating kelp, rip water, water temperature changes or floating debris and troll close around the parameter but not through. Also watch for diving birds and bait fish. A good bet is to zigzag in and out of the blue water where it meets the green. Many bait fish prefer green water. Ask other fishermen or boaters if they know approximately how far out the blue water is, this will give you a basic idea of how far to go before you start looking for it.

So remember hot weather puts bottom dwellers deep but the surface action can be fantastic. Check with your favorite tackle pro for recommendations on gear, lures and a demo on how to rig for


game fish and enjoy the "Hot Action" during the summer months.



#### Sailfish (Pez Vela)

The Sailfish's body is dark blue on it's back with a bright silver stomach and a very large dorsal fin. They may be seen basking on the surface following the warm waters to the upper Gulf in late May or early June. 100 lb. fish are common, but fish up to 182 lbs. have been recorded. Very poor food value, so please practice catch and release





#### Black Skipjack (Barrilete)

Their body color is dark on top, silvery on the bottom with stripes running down the back and 3-5 black spots on the abdomen just below the pectoral fin. They migrate to the upper Gulf in late May or early June. May weigh up to 12 lbs. The meat is very strong in flavor. Skipjack makes an excellent bait fish.


# How big do they grow and how old do they get?

That depends, male and females look different from each other and males are heavier than females of the same length. In comparison one 49.5 inch male weighed 47.5 pounds while a 50 inch female weighed only 26.6 pounds. One of the heaviest dorado ever reported was a 101 pound male caught off Puerto Rico, but the IGFA all tackle world record stands at 87 pounds.

One of the fastest growing fish on record, dorado gain an average of 10 percent of their body weight per day, a growth rate exceeded only by billfishes. The University of Miami reported one captive juvenile dolphin which grew from 1 pound to 35 pounds in one year. And another individual grew from 1.5 pounds to 11 pounds in 30 days.

Scientist aren't sure what maximum age dolphins might attain. In captivity, dorado live less than 5 years, but one dorado caught during a study off Florida, was 60 inches long and 77 pounds was aged at only four years.




# Dolphin Fish (Dorado)

The body is a brilliant golden-green in color. Snout profile of older males is blunt and high foreheaded, whereas the females head is more tapered. The Dorado likes warm blue waters and migrates to the upper Gulf in late May or early June. They are an excellent food fish and can grow up to 6 ft. in length and weigh up to 90 lbs.




Brandon Traverse with his first grouper.




# A Couple Of Fish To Be Proud Of





# HOW DO SEASHELLS GROW?

Seashells, and indeed all shells of the mullusk group, weather they live in fresh or salt water or on land, do not grow by adding cells of living tissue.

Instead, they gradually increase in size at one edge, called the growing edge, as crystals of minerals salts are secreted by a large, thin, enveloping flap of tissue called the mantle and laid down in a framework of a horn like substance called conchiolin.

Seashells are chiefly calcium carbonate, extracted from the water, according to the *Illustrated Encyclopedia of the Animal Kingdom* (Danbury Press). In the mantle, tiny tubes excrete the almost invisible specks of mineral salt that bind to the conchiolin.

Most shells have three layers: first, a protective outer skin of organic matter that may be smooth or rough; second, a layer of crystals arranged at right angles to the surface of the shell; and finally, an inner layer composed of overlapping crystals. In some mullusk, like oysters, this layer is pearly and iridescent.

Shells increase in size as material is added to the growing edge and in thickness as overlapping layers are added to the inner surface.


Sick bay reported no one had been reported sick. That was good news.







### What About Fishin'

The perfect fishing day seems to come around when you least expect it. Bill, Kathy, Carolyn and I headed out to a reef that Bill had fished the day before with good success (where he had caught the cotchi that landed him first place in the derby). Our initial goal was to get into some big cotchi and simply take advantage of the calm water. What we got exceeded our initial expectations.

When we first arrived at the reef, we anchored down and weren't really getting hit a lot. Bill and I decided to re-anchor in another position. We resumed fishing in our new position and started bringing in some substantial Cotchi. Carolyn (our eleven-year-old) was just letting her line out, headed for the bottom, when about half way down she was hit hard. She flipped the bail, set the hook and the fight was on! A few minutes later a stingray surfaced attached to the other end of her line. We estimated the beast at about twenty pounds! We worked with it until we had the hook out of its mouth and released it virtually unscathed. I re-rigged Carolyn's pole and we resumed fishing

About ten minutes after the stingray, Carolyn's line was hit hard again. This time she had hooked into something big on the bottom. Her pole was bent as if it was a surf rig, not a tuna stick! I held onto her so she could fight the fish without falling in. When she got this fish to the surface, we were surprised to see a sizable gulf grouper at the other end of the line! The grouper was Carolyn's first and turned out to be 30lbs. After fighting both the stingray and the grouper, Carolyn was exhausted but exhilarated.


About an hour after Carolyn's grouper, I was hit hard. I fought the fish, brought it to the surface, and discovered another grouper on the end of my line! This one turned out to be 35lbs. At the end of the day, we counted about 30 good size cotchi, two grouper and a big pargo. Not a shabby day at all!

It came the day after the derby, but who cares? Putting, not one but two grouper in the boat was reward enough. Watching a child catch their first grouper made the experience twice as rewarding! Thank you Tres Amigos!
