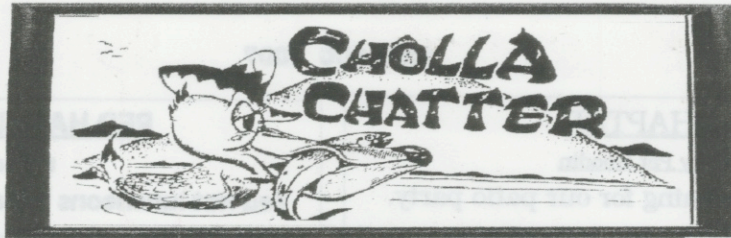

COOK'S CORNER

MUFFINS - from Nancy Schmidli

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 cup bran
- 2 tsp. soda
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- dash of salt

Mix the above together and make a well in the center where you will add:

- 1 cup grated carrots
- 1 chopped apple
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1/2 cup nuts
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 cup oil (Canola)

Stir until moist. Pour into muffin pans with paper muffin cup liners. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 min. or until done.

Double the recipe and these are great to freeze.

A FIRE IN CHOLLA - At approximately 1:00 A.M. on Saturday, May 12, the police, while on patrol, noticed a fire at "La Casa de la Sirena". (Rental owned by Bob Fredricks). They woke up the Cholla "Volunteer firemen", Jesus Arviso (Gia) and three of his sons - Aaron, Abraham and Arturo, who took the Cholla fire engine to the fire. Also, there to help were Gabriel Green and Jesus Cota Green, and Hipy Felix (with his water truck, just in case it was needed). The fire was in a utility room and was started in the electric service panel. The room is of rock and concrete, with an open vent in one end. The fire burned through this opening to the butane system outside the room. The gas lines from the tank to the building is of PVC (plastic), which melted and the gas was burning. The "firemen" were able to get to the gas valve and shut it off and then contain the fire before it got to anything else.. 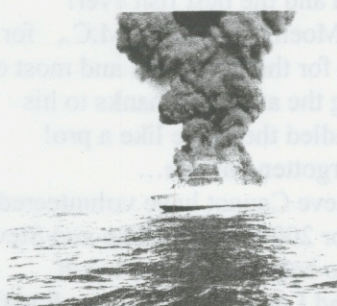
ROCKY POINT BOAT FIRE

Stuart had called Villa to have Red Cross ambulances standing by at the dock, and they were there waiting when the boat got there.

Kudos to all of the people on Stuart's boat and also the people on the Mexican Ponga boat that helped. Everyone survived, although at least on man got a few minor burns.

Again, if you have a boat, please check out your safely equipment each time before you go out. It's better to be safe than sorry. By the grace of God, these people got in safely. Also, try to buddy boat. That could save your life sometime.

John and Janice Power come from Mesa, Az. and have a cabin with Norma Power who has been a member for years. I think they must be related.

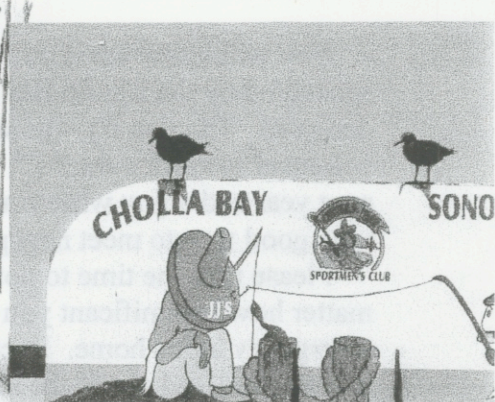
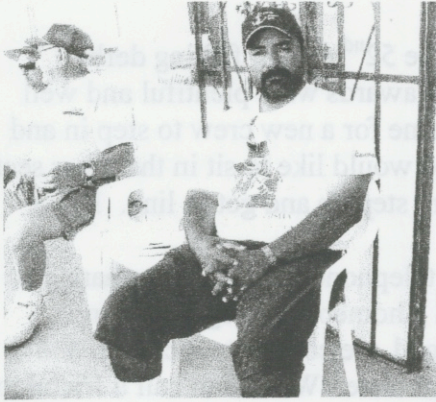

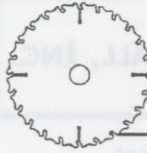
