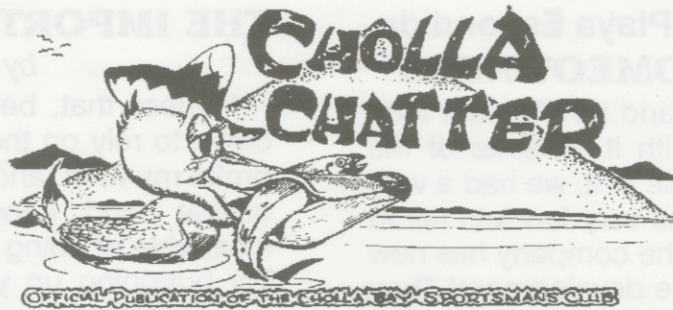

COOK'S CORNER

WALDORF SLAW

2 cups shredded purple cabbage
1 cup peeled and diced apple
1 cup diced celery
1/3 cup chopped walnuts
5 TBSP lite mayo
6 TBSP plain low-fat yogurt*
1 TBSP granulated Splenda (or 2 packs)
salt to taste

Place cabbage, apple, celery and walnuts in a large bowl. Mix mayo, yogurt, Splenda and salt in a small bowl and stir well. Add dressing to shredded cabbage mix. Toss well and refrigerate at least 30 minutes before serving.

Makes 6 servings.

Per serving:

calories - 100, carbs - 8 g, fat - 8 g, protein - 2 g.

* May use low fat sour cream instead of yogurt

A TIP TO TRY...

Subject: Heads up folks if you want to prolong the life of your dryer My heating unit went out of my dryer! The repairman went in to the dryer and pulled out the lint filter. It was clean. We always clean the lint from the filter after every load of clothes. He told us that he wanted to show us something. He took the filter over to the sink and ran hot water over it. Now, this thing is like a mesh--I'm sure you know what your dryer's lint filter looks like - WELL... the hot water just laid on top of the mesh!!! It didn't go through it at all!!! He told us that dryer sheets cause a film over that mesh and that's what burns out the heating unit. You can't SEE the film, but it's there. He said the best way to keep your dryer working for a very long time (and to keep your electric bill lower) is to take that filter out and wash it with hot soapy water and an old toothbrush (or other brush) at least every six months. He said that makes the life of the dryer at least twice as long! How about that????!!!!

Learn something new everyday!

I certainly didn't know dryer sheets would do that. So, thought I'd share! Note: I went to dryer and tested my screen by running water on it. The water collected a little but ran through the screen. I dried it off and was ready to put it back in the dryer since the water ran through it but, I thought what the heck it won't hurt to wash it while I had it out. Warm soap water and a nylon brush and I had it done in 30 seconds. I then ran the water over the screen and what a difference the water just gushed through it with no puddling at all and this time I was running the water at a faster rate. CHEATER CHILI

- 1 15 oz. can of original stewed tomatoes
- 1 15 oz. can of kidney beans with juice
- 2 15 oz. cans of pinto beans with juice
- ½ package of chili mix or more if preferred
- ½ jar Ortega salsa
- 1 small (4 oz) can whole kernel corn, drained
- ½ small can diced chilies
- 1 lb. Hamburger
- 1-2 cans water - for thicker chili, use less water

Cook hamburger and place in saucepan large enough to hold all the other ingredients and put everything else with the hamburger meat. Cook on low for about 1 hour to let everything meld together.

Serve with hot cornbread & butter. Yum Yum.
