As we drove in Betty met us and said she had seen our car lights and we were the only people in Cholla and there was a boat in trouble 18 miles out, and would we go out for it. I asked her to find a Mexican to go with us as it was just Grace and I. She found Hector and the three of us went out on a dark moonless night. Betty kept in touch with us and the other boat. We finally found them and towed them in arriving back in the bay at daylight. Betty was up all night keeping track of us. Betty left her stamp on the Gulf When she took over the radio, her regular sign off was "OKEY-DOKEY" Now, where ever you go up and down the Gulf, you hear, even the Mexicans, saying it.
